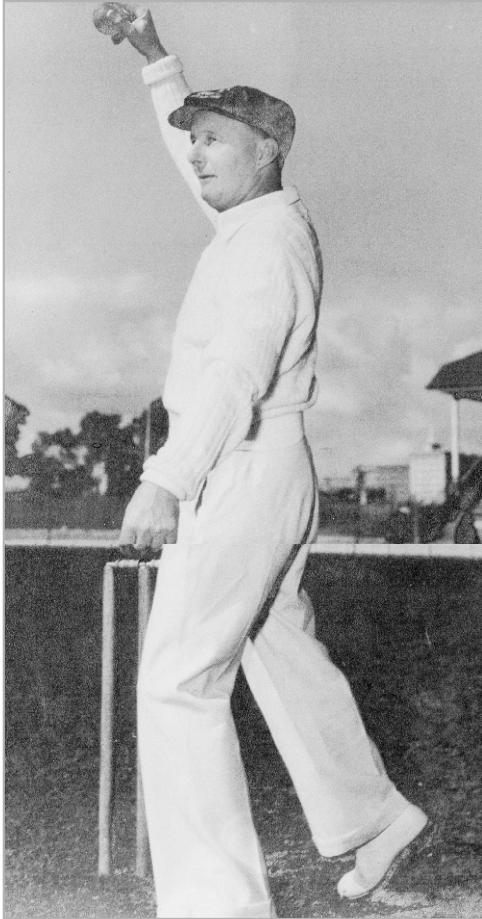

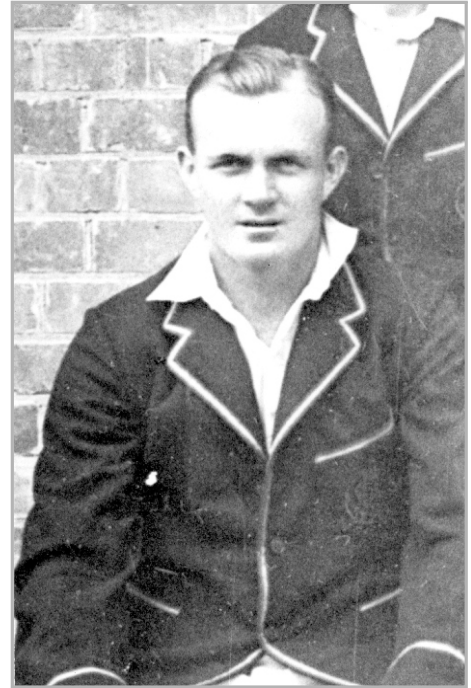
FROM THE ARCHIVES



■ A.J. Ryan

The great A J Ryan was born in Adelaide in 1904 and went on to play **32 matches** of cricket for South Australia between 1925 and 1937, as well as becoming a household name at the South Adelaide Football Club.

In an outstanding thirteen year 'A Grade' career with the Adelaide Cricket Club from 1922, A J Ryan scored **6220 runs** at a remarkable average of **56.03**. Becoming our **third highest run scorer**, his club aggregate rates behind only the great **Cec Starr** and **Bob Lee**. His **151 wickets** at **25.53** came in very handy also, in a period where the 'TriColours' were a star-studded lineup.



For his State, he averaged **just under 30** with the bat and took **19 wickets**, but his extraordinary ability is most noticeable when looking at the Adelaide club's **Honour Board at Glandore**.

In a quite amazing thirteen year stretch, between 1922 and 1935, A. J. Ryan won the 'A Grade' batting award **10 times**, with Cec Starr chipping in for the other three. Ryan has won this title (now the '**Roly Vaughton Memorial Batting Award**') more than any other person in our club's history.

■ Ron Sharpe

Ron Sharpe was a much celebrated slow bowler for the Adelaide Cricket Club, playing in the club's 'A Grade' side for an amazing **21 years**, from **1927 to 1948**.

With an untouchable **587 wickets** at **20.39** in 'A Grade' he remains the highest wicket taker for the Adelaide Cricket Club in its 98 year history. This was the only district club for which Ron played, and this record places him the **top 10** on SACA's District wicket taking list, alongside the likes of other past players **Clarrie Grimmett**, **Joe Travers** and **Andrew Sincock**.

During this time, Ron was the winner of the 'A Grade' club bowling award (now the 'Clarrie Grimmett Memorial Bowling Award') on **9 occasions**, with his best return yielding a season's tally of **56 wickets**. With unlucky timing that meant competition for higher honours included Clarrie Grimmett himself, Ron never got the opportunity to represent his State at first class level.

The 'Ron Sharpe Memorial Fielding Trophy' for the best fielder in A Grade is named in his honour.

Buffalos Farewell to 'Bison'

Adelaide's genial giant of a fast bowler, Erin 'Bison' Bernhardt, has suggested he may be retired (that's his mates at right giving him a final send-off at the end of the last game down at Woodville Oval).

In typical fashion he took a few wickets and struck a few strong blows in mock anger - before braving the 'gauntlet of the bats' as he left the arena, possibly for the last time.

The Bison leaves us with **216 'A' Grade wickets** for the club (at 23.45) which puts him at **12th.** on the **all-time Adelaide wicket-taking list**.

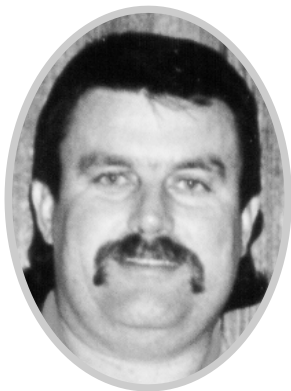


As a hard-hitting bat he had **106 innings**, (with **34 Not Outs**), belting **1,466 runs** at the healthy average of **20.36** (with a highest

score of **71 not out!**)

Not bad stats to show for **10 yrs. of fun** - so thanks for the happy memories, big fella!

Firstly, my heartiest congratulations to our **two Premiership Teams** this season! With convincing wins in their Grand Finals, both our **'C' Grade & Under/16 Red** teams ensured the Adelaide Cricket Club again achieved Major Round success. Junior Coach Eric Freeman covers the Under/16 premiership in more detail on the Junior Page, but from a senior perspective, our 'C' Grade really did us proud!

Although **'Pos'** and his boys absolutely dominated the competition for the entire season, only losing one game, they won with one of the most inexperienced line-ups ever so their Premiership was richly deserved.

Disappointingly, our **'A' Grade** missed the finals by *less than one win* and can now only look forward to next season.

On the plus side, we were able to 'blood' some more new young faces into our top side and, after having secured Major Round participation in the West End Cup for the *fourth time in five years*, a place in the Grade finals would have been a fitting reward for our Club. At the end it was perhaps a little disappointing (for a number of reasons) that it was not quite possible this year.

Our **'B' Grade** again competed in the finals but were disappointing in the semi-final against arch-rival Sturt. We were genuine Premiership contenders in this grade, yet just *one poor hour of batting* after lunch on the first day saw us give away a spot in the Grand Final.

Whilst talking about the 'B' Grade, it was fabulous to see **Nathan Job** win the **Keith Butler Medal** (judged by the umpires as the most outstanding player in the grade). Nathan's solid performances during the season certainly contributed to the success of the 'B' Grade, and, having made his 'A' Grade debut for the club in the final minor round game, a second 'B' Grade Premiership would have really topped off a great year!

As for the **'D' Grade**, **Neil Gillespie's** boys did a good job. Though winless prior to Christmas the 'D's continued to persevere and won two of their five games after the break. A great effort - considering there were to up to *five changes to the side every match!*

Finally, as Club Coach, as a Life Member, and as a long-serving '*part of the furniture*' at Adelaide, I guess I am definitely and proudly biased towards the Adelaide Cricket Club, but even allowing for this, I consider we have now established ourselves as one of the **most dominant Clubs** in *Grade Cricket*. We have at this time **more current Test Players** than any other Club; more **contracted State Players** than any other Club; and we have also won at least **one Premiership** in each of the four Senior Grades over the past four seasons!

Considering the high number of new youngsters we have also introduced to senior cricket during this period I am personally exceptionally proud of our club's recent efforts...

Club Record

Warren 'Bugsy' Smith has become Adelaide Cricket Club's record Dismissal holder, in the last game of the 2001/02 season.

With a Daniel Harris edge at Woodville Oval, Nathan Job's first wicket became Number 371 for Bugsy, enough to sneak past previous Adelaide keeper and club legend Steve Gentle.

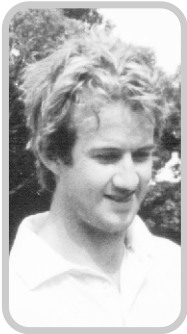
In 1984/85, at 15 years of age, Bugsy was offered a last minute spot in Ian 'Butch' Harry's D-Grade side and went on to play 'C's' under Steve Faulkner before finally serving a 4 year apprenticeship in the 'B grade' under well-known captains Adrian Merrett and Chris 'Banga' Price.

The longest serving member of our present 'A Grade', Warren debuted as the keeper in 1987/88, before finally cracking the side

permanently as a batsman in 1988/89, under his captain and mentor Steve Gentle, and then taking the gloves on again in the 1989/90 season.

'Bugs' has claimed 371 'A' Grade dismissals (336 c, 35 st) and accumulated 3900 runs, rating Mike Hendricks, Steve Gentle and all past coaches as great influences over the past 17 years. It's been a tremendously sustained effort, Bugsy! Well Played.

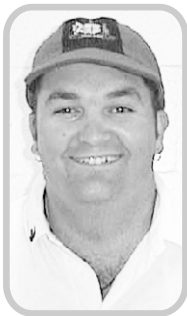

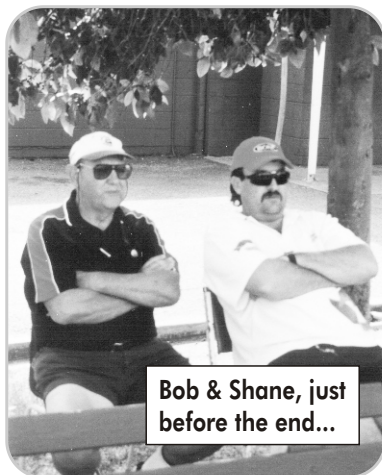

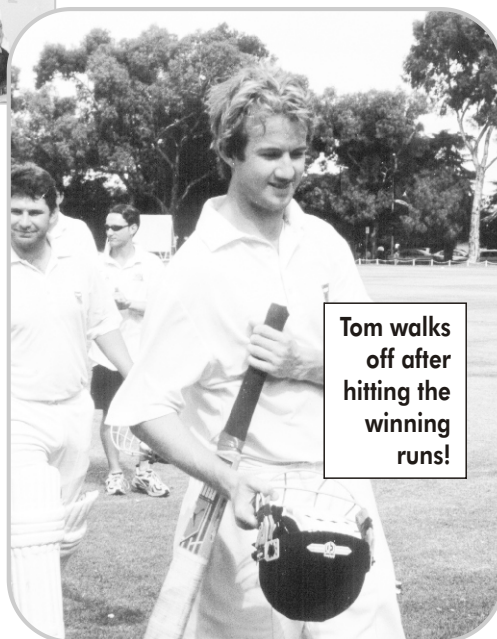

Junior Season Report



Eric Freeman,
Club Junior Coach,
summarises our
Club's Junior
performances
for 2001/2002...

The Adelaide Cricket Club has once more excelled in the *SACA Junior Comp.* with a *Premiership (U/16 Red)* and a *Semi-Final (U/14 Reds)*. The *U/16 Whites* finished **5th** and the *U/14 Whites* **7th**. We have again provided an opportunity for boys to play at a level to suit their ability, promoting to higher grades when opportunities have arisen. *No less than 8 boys played Senior Grade cricket this season and 3 others played 1st X1* for their school or college.

This season our **U/16 Squad** was strong with several members of the *2001 U/14 Reds Premiership* team vying for positions. After a slow start, the **Red** team started to find form after Xmas, culminating in their magnificent *outright* victory against the danger team Tea Tree Gully - and eliminating them from the finals. In the *Semi-Final* we restricted *Sturt* to 187, a total we passed on the Sunday with 13 overs to spare. **Ben Zanol** made a fine 50 and **Scott Carman** 48. The Grand Final was always going to be tough as *Adelaide* had to replace 3 players on the Sunday because of *State Under 15 Championship* commitments in Bendigo. In spite of this, our boys bowled their hearts out on Saturday to restrict the *Southern District Stingrays* to 146. **Phil Maddocks** (4/35) and **Adam Lidiard** (3/10) claimed the majority of the wickets, but a lot of credit must go to **Sam Cabot** who bowled 16 overs of off spin (0/28) on top of his 16 overs on the trot in the *Semi-Final* (1/27). The Sunday race chase was completed at 5/147 with 19 overs to spare.

Phil Maddocks capped off a brilliant season with 514 runs and 47 wkts. **Sam Cabot** 142 runs/15 wkts, **Scott Carman** 165 runs, **Ali Fraser** 143 runs/22 wkts, **Nick Grbin** 157 runs, **Glenn Knott** 127 runs/19 wkts, **Adam Lidiard** 15 wkts, **James Raman** 154 runs, **Sam Raphael** 191 runs, & **Ben Zanol** 418 runs (for Reds and Whites) all made contributions. Our very popular *Team Manager*, **John Bannister**, must also take a lot of credit for the victory, moulding the boys into a very formidable team after Xmas. My thanks go also to **Frank Grbin** for his fine assistance on match days.

The **U/16 White** team missed out playing in the finals by only a couple of bonus points. The *Whites* were well captained by **Matt Quist** & **James Bond** and managed extremely well by **Jim Bond** and **Brian Quist**. Some outstanding performances included **Karan Chauhan** making 104 n.o. and 90, **Ben Zanol** 114, **Travis Wright** (some handy scores in a hurry) and **Daniel Bakewell** (consistent with both bat and ball). **Bondy** claimed 29 wkts, **Ben Wick** 26, **James Pitcher** 24, **Quisty** 20 and **Will Spargo** 17. We retain 19 of our *U/16's* for next season & 15 move on to the Seniors. We wish all these boys well in the next stage of their continuing development.

At the start of the season we introduced many new **U/14** players to the Club. Boys who took part in the *U/14 Whites semi-final* in 2001 made up most of this year's **Reds** team. Unfortunately, the **U/14 Red** team didn't achieve their batting potential, but their bowling time after time saved the team. However, when the **Reds** got a sniff of making the finals, they began to fire up - making 240+ against *Glenelg* - then defeating *TTG* outright to grab 4th position. In the *Semi* (against *Southern Districts*) our boys bowled extremely well to bowl them out for 156, but some of the boys lacked a bit of concentration at vital stages & we finally went down by only 9 runs. Captain **Craig Dollman** made 61 n.o. while **Sam Bolch** (3/17) and **Jackson Ramsay** (3/42) led the way with the ball.

Next season 19 of these boys will go on to *U/16's* next season and only 9 will stay on in *U/14's*. The outstanding contributors with the bat for the *U/14 Reds* were **Ryan Sawade** 416, **Craig Dollman** 259, **Matt Nicholas** 386 (Reds and Whites) and **Kyle Tapscott** 265. With the ball, **Jackson Ramsay** took 28 wickets, **Tom Chapman** 24, **Alex Hutchins** 22, **Ryan Sawade** 22 and **Sam Bolch** 14. Well done to *Team Manager* **Bruce Ramsay** and coach **Greg Wyman** for their valuable contribution throughout the season.

The **U/14 White** Team was very raw but performed well, only narrowly missing out playing in finals. **Philip Neate** (still eligible for 2 seasons of *U/14's*) led the way with the bat (496 runs, 2 centuries) while other valuable contributions came from **Zach Butler** 277, **Scott Luders** 178 (reds and whites), & **Malcolm Pitcher** 140. With the ball **Malcolm Pitcher** took 19 wkts, **Alex Garlick** 12, **Luke Behn** 16 and young **Neate** 11. Our thanks must go to **Trevor Neate** for his outstanding coaching of the youngsters, and **Trevor** will hopefully be involved with the **Reds** again next season as these boys continue on with the development of their game.

Congratulations also to Sam Raphael, Ali Fraser and Scott Carman on being selected in the Under 15 State Team.

I must take this opportunity to thank **Mike Raphael** for his excellent support as *Junior Co-Ordinator*; to thank the *Team Managers and assistants*, **John Bannister**, **Jim Bond**, **Bruce Ramsay**, **Greg Wyman**, **Trevor Neate** and **Brian Quist** for their help at trainings and match days; and my thanks also to **Steve Clifton** and **Bob Harris** for looking after the *Under 15's* and *13's*.

To all the parents and families who have supported their son throughout this last season I must say a huge Thank you! I still firmly believe that the **Adelaide Club** has continued to maintain a higher level of interested parental support at all Junior games than any other Club!

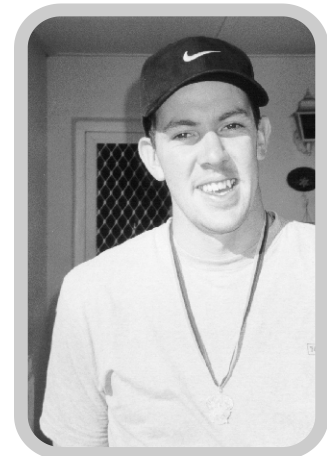
