

## **Preparing for Finals...**



Shane Bernhardt, Senior Club Coach, summarises the Season with only two rounds to go....

With only two rounds to go our A & B Grade sides are not as well positioned to make their charge towards finals - due to a couple of heart-breaking very narrow losses in the last round. Both sides need to win the two remaining matches to have a slim hope of Major Round participation, while having to rely on the results of other teams. This is a reasonable position to be in when considering the high player turnover we always experience in any season, bringing about the resultant need to constantly 'blood' new players.

In 'A' Grade our side has performed particularly well with tight wins over Southern Districts and Sturt as well as a magnificent outright win over then top four side West Torrens.

Over the course of these matches, our batting has shown more consistency, with players conscious of developing partnerships. We have bowled 'good lines' and most importantly backed up the bowlers with better performances in the field. I have no doubt our young group of players have learned a great deal over this time!

Our 'B' Grade side, under the capable leadership of the former "A" keeper, Warren "Bugsy" Smith - playing as a batsman only - has had a rather mixed season with some good tight wins and a few disappointing games mixed in. However, like the 'A's, they are poised to play finals if they keep on winning.

Unfortunately, for our 'C's & 'D's, finals participation looks to be out of reach

but it is still important for these teams to finish off the season strongly. It is a great opportunity for most of them - particularly the younger players - to gain as much experience as possible at senior level in preparation for next season.

It is also tremendous to see our young 'A' Grade spinner Dan Cullen rewarded with selection in the Australian U/19 Team following a very successful U/19 State Carnival (where he took a bag of wickets). Dan has enjoyed a fine debut season at 'A' Grade level and his higher honours were well deserved. No doubt Dan must be putting some pressure on our State selectors for a look at first class action...

Our 'A' Grade skipper, Lachlan Stevens has also just made his debut for S. A. in the One-Dayers against Queensland and N.S.W., after a magnificent Grade season leading Adelaide from the front with runs AND wickets. Well Played, Lachie!

Additionally, Jack Smith, (our 'stand-in skipper' for Lachie in the last game), has showed some tremendous form with us recently and MUST be putting his name in front of the state selectors as well.

We have just FOUR WEEKS of cricket remaining - whether the 'A's and/or 'B's play finals is partly up to us. We have the great challenge ahead of us, but I am confident it is one that we can achieve

## It's THAT time again...

Once again, we can report that *all* four SACA Junior Teams have a good chance of playing off in the finals. At the completion of **Round 8** (Feb 1st.) the *U16 Reds* are *1st*, the *U16 Whites* are *3rd*, the *U14 Reds* are *4th* and the *U14 Whites* are also *4th*.

The *U15 team* - in the *South Central Junior Association* - have performed above expectations and may also be a chance of winning the title.

The SACA Under 16 Reds are now starting to fulfil their capabilities with consistent performances and although we lose some players for the remainder of the minor round (at least), to College First X1, I still rate the team a reasonable chance to win back-to-back flags. Scott Carman, Sam Raphael, Chris Geddie, Scott Clafton and Sam Cabot are the five players we will definitely miss.

The leading run-getters so far in the U16's are: Ben Zanol 326, Kurt Laatz 354 (Red and White), Ryan Sawade 200, Matt Quist 168, Brad Portlock 168 (combined), Scott Carman 143, Sam Cabot 115 and Nik Ciruak 102.

The **leading bowlers** are: Sam *Cabot 16 wickets, Craig Dollman and Ryan Sawade 12* wickets each, and *Adam Lidiard 10.* The Reds have 3 tough games to complete the minor round - West Torrens, Southern Districts and Northern Districts.

The **U16 Whites** have been in the top two all season, but after losing a vital game (against Prospect last Saturday) will need a big lift in the batting if they are to participate in the finals. With the Reds requiring several players from here on, there will be opportunities for so-called "fringe" players to step up and to prove the selectors wrong!

Leading rungetters so far are: Adam Kennedy 136, Matt Nicholas 179, Adam Perry 158 and Kyle Tapscott 121, while the leading bowlers are: Will Spargo with 20 wickets, Jackson Ramsay 18 (combined), and Matty Nicholas on 11.

The **Under 14 Reds** are also now hitting their straps and, although they do have a tough run home to the finals, I think they can make it particularly after the thrilling win against Prospect with their backs to the wall. Prospect made 189 and after 12 overs we were 6/46, with Will Kearvell at the hospital and out of the game we were virtually 7/46. But full marks to Matthew Nobes 52\* and Michael Maurici 61, these 2 boys put on 126 runs and steered the team to within 22 runs of victory. Josh Carver came in and belted 19\* in 9 balls and it was all over...so well done Reds... just shows what can be done when you build partnerships! That win has put the Reds 26 points in front of fifth side Prospect - where a loss would have seen Prospect in the four, instead...

Leading rungetters are Scott Luders 257, Luke Behn 191, Malcolm Pitcher 184, Matthew Nobes 143, Adam Willson 141 and Michael Maurici 129 while Maurici has taken 14 wickets, Luke Behn 13 and Josh Carver 10.

The **Under 14 Whites** are a young team but have learnt a great amount under the guidance of *Barrie Curtin*. Most of these boys are only 11, 12 or 13 years of age and will be Reds players in the future. This team also won a thriller against Prospect by only 1 run which now sees Adelaide 4th and Prospect 5th. Well done to the boys, you've got a hard run home but, with all of the squad available for the remainder of the season, we should see a much stronger team competing for a spot in the finals...

Leading rungetters are: Jamie Kempster 191, Cameron Lithgow 101, Chris Muggleton 89 (combined) and Alex Curtin 76. Both Patrick Hartland and Alex Garlick (combined) have taken 11 wickets, Myles Perry and Tom Fitzgerald 9 and Curtin 6.

Our training will be stepped up from now on in an effort to get all 4 teams into the finals! **Good luck** to all boys!

Andrew MACKIE (who batted at No. 4): Drafted to Geelong F. C. at pick No. 7 in the 2002 draft.

Tom CHADWICK (No. 3 Bat): Premierships with West Adelaide U/17's & U/19's in successive years (2001 & 2002), also Tomkins Medal for Best & Fairest (SANFL U/19) after playing ½ season.

Nic WEST (opening bowler): SA rep. - Volleyball.

Rowan BAILEY: (opening bowler): achieves a perfect 20 in 5 subjects to gain scholarship for 5 years at University.

**Daniel LOVERIDGE:** plays off low single-figure handicap at golf.

**Luke WARBURTON:** Captain Westminster 1st. XI at Cricket.
