We have booked the Ridings Room at Adelaide Oval on the Saturday Night of the 10th. Dec. for our first Centenary Dinner where the DVD of our history will be released, among other celebrations. More about this function when we get a little closer...

Much has been said about this being our Centenary Season - and much more will be said! I urge all members and supporters of Adelaide to get behind your Club's Committee to make this season one to be remembered for another 100 years! Yes, there is most definitely a hint of warmth in the air...

OUR FIRST MATCH

From a newspaper report published on Monday, September 18, 1905:

"A meeting was held on Tuesday evening, at 23 Waymouth St., for the purpose of completing amalgamation of the East Adelaide & West Adelaide Cricket Clubs. Alderman Johnson presided over a large attendance. The report of the subcommittee appointed to draw up the rules was submitted by Mr. H. Blinman, and the rules as read were adopted.

A resolution, proposed Mr. G. Giffen, and seconded by Mr. H. W. Short -'That the East Adelaide and West Adelaide cricket clubs amalgamate in terms of the resolution passed at the meeting of the Cricketing Assoc.' was carried. The following officers were elected: Patron, the Governor; vice-patrons, Drs. Swift and W. Magarey; president, Mr. G. Dutton Green; committee, Messrs. Sullivan, Sands, Cowan, Leak, Travers, and Blinman. Messrs. S. J. Dailey and A. S. Toms were appointed delegates".

(A separate meeting was convened and a 2nd. club was formed to join in the Second Grade, which was re-formed with the aim of strengthening the 'A' Grade team with promising College players).

The New Club's first A Grade match was a 2-day Game starting Saturday, October 7 with completion on the following Saturday. The Newspaper published the following summary on Monday, October 9, 1905...

A GRADE. ADELAIDE VERSUS NORTH ADELAIDE.

District club cricket opened in fine weather on Saturday. A considerable number of people assembled on the Neutral Ground to watch the game between Adelaide and North Adelaide, and some fair cricket was witnessed. Adelaide won the toss and remained at the wickets the whole afternoon, losing nine wickets for 170.

A prominent feature of the innings was the stand made by Travers and Sparks for the sixth wicket, 52 runs being added before the pair were separated. For the last few seasons Travers's batting has steadily improved and by the way he shaped up on Saturday ... his hitting was clean and confident, & formed a great contrast to the scratchy game he played a couple of seasons back. Going in with the score 44 for four wickets, Travers remained in possession until the total had been taken to 116, and he hit 5 fours. Rees ultimately bowled him middle stump with a beauty.

Sparks played in a slower game than his partner, and was not out 39 when stumps were drawn. He received valuable assistance from Richardson, who contributed 28 out of the 49 put on by the eighth wicket. Bailey, Magarey, and Leak showed glimpses of form, and it is evident the Adelaides are a strong combination. When C. B. Jennings, who was away on Saturday, returns, the team will have a strong lot of batsmen, and with Short, Travers, and Cowan leading the attack. the side will not want for respectable bowlers. It seems that Claxton will not play for the Norths again, which is a very big loss. On last years form, Claxton is the best all-round man in the State.

Rees bowled admirably on Saturday, his length being difficult, and his pace well mixed. His three wickets cost 68 runs, but allowance must be made for the runs due to the rough outfield, which greatly aided the batsmen. Gibbons dismissed a couple of good men, and Reedman, who went on late in the afternoon, got rid of two men cheaply. The fielding of the North Adelaide men was loose, but the ground was all against them".

The same paper summarised the end of the exciting match on the Monday following the 2nd. week's play:

"The match between Adelaide and North Adelaide was continued on the Neutral Ground on Saturday, and provided a remarkably exciting finish, Adelaide winning by the narrowest possible margin. A week previously Adelaide made 170 for the loss of nine wickets, and on Saturday the innings closed after a single run had been added. On going to the wickets North Adelaide started badly, Rees failed to score, and Jennings, Pellow, and Stevenson gave little trouble, four wickets going down for 12.

Drew, of whom great things are expected, managed to reach double figures, and helped J. C. Reedman to take the score to 26 for the fifth wicket. From this point the batting underwent a complete change. Reedman played a fine innings of 35, and found a staunch partner in H. M. Jay, who is one of the most promising batsmen turned out by the colleges during the last year or two.

He is a left-hander, with a graceful and effective style, & promises to become a useful hitter. The total was 86 when Reedman left, and then Jay and then McKechnie put on 26 for the seventh wicket, McKechnie contributing 11. The eighth wicket fell at 126, and the ninth at 142, and it looked a pretty easy thing for Adelaide.

However, Aveyard, the last batsman, played a careful game, as Jay hit, and soon after 5 o'clock the Norths had crept up to within one run of their opponents' total. Excitement was now intense among the players and spectators, each ball being watched with eager interest.

A shout of delight and disappointment went round the field when Jay was brilliantly caught by Bailey off Cowan in making what would have been the winning hit - had a less capable fieldsman been in Bailey's place. Adelaide were thus victors by 1 run.

Jay played a sterling innings of 89 - more than half the runs made during the afternoon. He hit 9 fours.

A feature of the game was the fine fielding of Cowan, who brought off two splendid catches in the slips".

Did You Know?

Adelaide bowled out Kensington for only 119 at the Kensington Oval in 1954/55 with SEVEN of the ten batsmen adjudged out LBW...

In our winning Grand Final against West Torrens at Adelaide Oval in 1958/59 TWO of our batsmen left the field when one wicket fell. After baulking to avoid a mid-wicket collision, Bob Lee was run out and Leon Hill retired - with a leg injury.

During the 1925/26 season, ACC bowler Eric Wickens managed to strike the stumps on THREE separate occasions without dislodging a single bail!

East Adelaide and West Adelaide amalgamated in September, 1905 and in the ensuing 100 seasons 506 Players have represented our Club at 'A' Grade level.

Ken Cunningham is our youngest debutante - 15 years and 75 days old when he debuted in 1954/55.


George Giffen is the oldest player to represent our club at A Grade level. George was 51 years and 8 months when he finished at the end of the 1910/11 season.

Joe Travers, who finished his career in 1921/22 at 51 years, 2 months, scored his maiden A Grade century aged 50 years & 3 months against West Torrens at Adelaide Oval in 1920/21. Joe's 101 was his ONLY century in a career which spanned 32 years (17 years with Adelaide from 1905/06 - 1921/22).

Adelaide's third highest run scorer A J (Bulla) Ryan (6220 runs at a respectable 56.03) was also a very fine footballer. 'Bulla' kicked seven goals in the last quarter of an SA v Vic match in 1928.

Our highest ever wicket-taker, Ron Sharpe, (587 wickets @ 20.39) NEVER played a first class match! However, Ron DID represent SA in Baseball, and has been referred to as 'one of the top three Pitchers' ever produced by Australia...

JUNIOR REPORT


