Following on last year's successful centenary season, we entered this first year of our club's 2nd. Century with big challenges. The retirement of Ben Johnson left a big hole in the A's, creating an opportunity for an aspiring player to stand up, but the induction of four new young players Michael Maurici (513), Rick Francis (514), Adam Lidiard (515) & David Reynolds (516) into our 'A' side just demonstrates our thinking for the future...

Thanks to a top concerted effort by Andrew Ramage and our band of volunteers who helped to complete the internal painting, we were able to use the new dressing rooms for the start of the season, & we have since settled in reasonably well and now feel right at home. You'll have noticed that the renovations to our clubrooms are almost completed but we will need some volunteers to paint the interior, (any interested people please contact me!).

When your committee decided preseason to replace our practice area nets a very competitive quote from 'Advanced Nets and Ropes' saw us place an order for the completion of new nets before the 2006/07 season started. Our part of the deal was to supply and erect poles to support the structure, but with incredible assistance from Peter Bahnert (from Bahnert Steel Supplies Pty. Ltd.) & Andrew Ramage (from JK Ramage Builders) - both long-term sponsors of our Club, we were able to put the structure in place ready for the nets to go up. This policy is now working very smoothly. On a rotational basis three junior players have also trained with the seniors each week...

COLIN PINCH



As a batsman Colin scored 3,488 runs @ 53.66, with a highest score of 150 and was a well-respected Life Member of our Club. Our condolences are extended to Colin's family from all his friends and team-mates...



UNTOLD HISTORY

From the distant past comes the story of a young Adelaide cricketer torn between two sports. As the story (at right) shows VIC HARRIS, aged 20, was exhibiting some talent as an opening batsman who could 'bowl a bit'. The match was played on March 30 1940

and not long after young Vic Harris joined the Army. In August 1944 he broke an arm while driving a truck and was sent to an 'R & R' camp at Berry Springs near Darwin. In one incredible stroke of misfortune he became the victim of 'friendly fire'. While lying on his bunk reading,



some blasting exercises were taking place nearby, and young Vic was killed instantly when a stray lump of rock hit him in the chest. This sad story was sent in by his daughter Wendy, who was only $2\frac{1}{2}$ at the time, and we are happy to pass it on...

Warren 'Bugsy' Smith Adelaide Cricket Club Legend


In the early summer of 1980 Warren Smith, a skinny cricket-mad school boy up from the southern Adelaide Morphett Vale East Primary School, was chosen to represent Adelaide Cricket Club for the first time - in what is now known as the Sutton Shield.

Last week a slightly older (& also a touch more battle-scarred) Warren triumphantly led his youthful group of happy team-mates to a deserved 'B' Grade Premiership - his second, only 20 seasons after his first in the SAME grade!

Ruefully, a tired but satisfied 'Bugs' realised that at least FOUR of his teammates had not even been born when he played in the last one...

One of the genuine nice blokes at the Club, he has racked up a truly memorable career with Adelaide, and though easily our oldest player still competing, his exuberance for the game sets a great example for all the eager youngsters hoping to make their own marks.



2006/2007 Junior Round-up

The 2006/07 season loomed as a challenge for the junior squads, due to a substantial loss of players from last season (over 30 overall, 24 from the under 16's alone). This considered, the overall performances far exceeded expectations and thanks must go to all players who represented the Adelaide Cricket Club in all junior grades.

Congratulations must go to the U/17 and U/14 White teams who qualified for the finals, finishing 4th. and 2nd. respectively. Although the under 17's had to 'forfeit' their semi-final, the 14 Whites capped off a fine season by winning the Grand Final.

Though the U/16 Red, U/16 White, U/14 Reds and U/15 teams finished lower down the ladder, their performances were very creditable, especially considering the lack of continuity in team selection because of regular player unavailability.

Our Junior philosophy is to develop young cricketers into at least 'A' Grade players for the Buffalos - hopefully even to State and National representation.

In an effort to expedite the development of experience and maturity as cricketers, full autonomy has been given to the players on match day, with the Captains, supported by the rest of the team, making all the decisions. In each of the junior teams there are some exciting prospects for the future, none more than each of the captains from the U/14, U/16, U/15 and U/17 teams.

Nick Pedersen, Russel McLean, Daniel Payne & Scott Norris have demonstrated exceptional leadership qualities and have been more than ably supported by Simon Potts, Jamie Banfield, Ashley Lithgow, Luke Walker and their respective teams. Also, in an effort to further development of our juniors, we have given the players the opportunity to play (when performances justified the opportunity) and train at a higher level. That is, the U/16's with the seniors (thanks to the co-operation of Sean Watt) and the U/14's with the U/16's.

Lindsay Clift, Hayden Head, Junaid Abro and Anthony Jennings all played senior cricket this season, acquitting themselves extremely well, indicated by Anthony taking 5/35 and making 65 with the bat in the 'D' grade semi-final. U/14's players Daniel Payne, Rupert Peake and Nick Briotta all finished the season playing in the under 16's and again each with more than credible performances.

A special mention must go to our country players (with wonderful support from their parents) who have the added pressures of extensive distances to travel on top of the normal match day stresses.

The return of Simon Potts (Wilmington), and Anthony Jennings from Mt. Gambier, although not available for every game, was greatly welcome (complemented by the appearance of some wonderful new talent) from country areas. The O'Neill brothers from Mount Gambier, Dillon and Matthew, had promising introductions to the club, as did Dylan Kokotis from Port Pirie, Ethan Vogelsang from Naracoorte and Tylor Bleasby from Tintinara. These players have to be congratulated on their wonderful performances and efforts this year, & we look forward to their continued involvement at Adelaide next season.

We were also well represented in State under-age Teams, with Cameron Valente and Jordan Davis performing well in the under 13's and Daniel Payne in the U/14 development squad. All these lads justly deserved their opportunity, representing our Club and the State with distinction.

Some other exceptional performances this season included fine Batting from Hayden Head Jamie Banfield & Cameron Lithgow each making wonderful centuries, and (though not quite a century) a superb 91 n.o. under difficult conditions by U/14 Red Captain Daniel Payne in the U/16 Whites. Bowling also produced some wonderful performances - like Elliot Satterthwaite's 5/7 in the Sutton Shield. Others to take five or more wickets in an innings were Daniel Hack, Craig Lancake and Kane Chapman.




