Coach's Report 1982/83.

Season 1982/83 was initially planned so as to re-establish our club as a major force in district cricket. Encouragement was given to our younger players and with a good sprinkling of seniors throughout the grades we had a good base on which to work. The strength of a club can only be gauged by its results on the field and the results this season were extremely encouraging for the future.

The attitude of players generally was very good and as a result of the efforts being made at practise we became consistent performers and therefore we were winning games. All through the grades the results were good, so much so that with only the last game of the minor round to play we were second in the club championships with a great opportunity to be at the top. Unfortunately with only one winning team out of four we slipped out of contention but heads can be held high with the efforts that we made and I feel confident that we will improve even further next season.

The A's performance I felt was a good one, with so many young players we weren't given much chance of success. The opportunity was given to a number of them to play in the top team and it was significant that those who played out the latter part of the season were those who were prepared to work hard at improving their game. To be a successful player there is no substitute for hard work.

The 'B' grade had a wonderful season although the climax was disappointing. Whilst a tie meant we dropped out of the finals, I felt that we had the opportunities to win, but after a tremendous effort we just missed out. The experience of playing in a pressure finals situation will stand these players in good stead for the future. Well done to "Banger" for a top year and I feel sure that as a captain he will have gained a lot from this season.

The 'C' grade are the champions and thoroughly deserved their success. Steve Faulkner had the disappointment of losing the grand final the previous season but the champagne certainly flowed in Adelaide's room this year. After two very high standard finals games and with a very competitive attitude, confidence in their own ability and a great desire to win, which was synonymous throughout the club this season, Steve had his reward and I congratulate him and all those who played in his team during the year.

After a slow start to the season the 'D' grade, under Hank Middleton's captaincy, finished off the year well and were unfortunate not to have made the finals. Of the senior grades this team suffered most from representative selections and/or absenteeism with as many as 5 or 6 changes some weeks, so it's to the credit of Hank and the ability of these very young players that they were in touch with the four at the end of the minor round.

The achilles heel of the club is the "J" grade team. The purpose of this team is two-fold, firstly for those who miss selection in the senior teams it is an opportunity to play a game of cricket and secondly it gives the selectors a guide as to the form of these players. Apparently some people feel that it is below their dignity to play in this grade.

Unfortunately there is a "Catch 22" situation, where if we don't win this grade our J grade won't be promoted to a higher division, but if our better players don't play then we certainly won't win too many games let alone a premiership. If people are not prepared to play in this team when picked then the selectors certainly have no way of assessing form and definitely will not pick anyone in preference to J grade players. I repeat what I said pre-season; if you are not pleased about which team you're in then prove by performing that the selectors were wrong. Thanks to Tony Wells for his tremendous efforts this year in what can only be described at best as a very difficult job.

To the executive and committee I would like to thank you for your complete support and co-operation. Thanks to Peter Judd for his efforts with the pre-season training and I can't thank Peter Moyle enough for his tremendous effort in taking on the onerous task of Practise Captain. Bert Griffin once again did his job superbly and his "apprentice" Brian Martin, at his first attempt at preparing wickets, generally did a good job. With this years experience behind him and under Bert's guidance, I feel sure our practise wickets will only get better next year.

On behalf of all the players thanks to the Tri-Colour committee for once again working extremely hard organising functions and fund-raising. I'm sure if the players supported their efforts a little more we would all be much better off. I would also like to thank all those people who supported our games throughout the season.

In summing up this year it is significant that our club has gained a reputation from other clubs for our excellent approach to the game, our ability to be very competitive, and that Adelaide Cricket Club is not only a club that makes up the number of teams in the competition any more but they are desperately keen to win and that they have the ability to do so. As our club is a very young club and for most of the players their cricket is all in front of them, and if we build on this years success, then we have developed a good base to make this a strong club for many years to come. Congratulations once again to the 'C' grade and let's make a big effort to increase our success next season.

'A' Grade Report - 1982/83.

As I mentioned in my earlier report I believe that the 'A' grade performance was a good one. I felt at the beginning of the season that with so many youngsters, if we could win 4 games I would be happy. So good were the results that with 2 games left we had 6 wins including the only outright victory in A grade, and were a real finals contender. Unfortunately, we were not good enough to win those matches mainly because of an inability to handle vital games. I'm sure that those young players who played in these games have gained invaluable experience and opposing clubswill find us much more difficult to beat in the future.

When a club has first class players in its ranks it can feel proud, our club is doubly fortunate as the two people we had involved this season, Kim Harris and Andrew Sincock, not only are top players they are top clubmen as well. Both give everything they have to each game irrespective of whether it's Sheild or Grade cricket. They both support the club's activities as well as the time they are prepared to give to other players. Kims effort in successfully organising the Walk-a-thon needs special mention.

Steve Gentle was selected as the States No.2 keeper and fared well in that position against Victoria in the 2nd XI game. The highlight of Steve's year would have been his brilliant 161 n.o. against Glenelg who amongst their attack boosted the great West Indian bowler in Joel Garner.

Ian Carmichael's season can only be described as interesting. Initially there was some doubt as to whether he would play district cricket this year. After considering his position he decided to play and the rest is history. His holidays didn't allow him to play the first game of the year therefore he was selected in the 'B' grade for the next match. Although his performances were very good he had to bide his time in the 'B's' due to other players excellent efforts in the top team. When the opportunity came he took it "boots and all" and started to realise the potential he was capable of. So good were his efforts that the state selectors included him in the state squad after only a handful of games and I'm confident that providing he continues to work with the same endeavour he could eventually become a first class cricketer.

Andrew Ramage and Steve Trenorden are two of the young players who fared well in their initial 'A' grade season. Both of these young men have the necessary requirements to develop into top class players; they have undoubted ability and they are prepared to work hard at their game as they are determined to be successful. Steve unfortunately was unable to go to Perth with Andrew and Darren McGlashan in the S.A. under 19 side due to employment problems but now that he has changed his job he will be able to give more time to his game and I feel sure that next season will be a big year for him. He is an excellent middle order batsman, a very good fieldsman and has a lot of potential as a medium pace bowler. Andrew is a very talented batsman with the temperament of a much older player and he can only be described as a brilliant close to the wicket fieldsman. He also will develop his medium pace bowling with more opportunities and I predict a big future for him.

Bruce Worthington I feel can give the club a much needed lift in the slow bo-ling area. He played the last half of the season and equipped himself reasonably well and with more experience could go a long way. As well as a top fieldsman in any position, he can handle the bat very confidently as he displayed on a few occasions.

Peter Judd had a very interesting season batting in the difficult No.3 slot. As we failed to get a decent start all season his job was made even harder. I felt he handled it well, getting a good start on most occasions and valued his wicket as all good players do. Both times he passed 50 opposition bowlers failed to get him out. An excellent fieldsman, Peter is certainly going to be a valuable player to the club for a long time.

Adrian Merrett has been a member of our club in excess of ten seasons and yet this was the first time he has played a full season in 'A' grade. He had the job of batting 5 and his purpose was to make sure we built partnerships in the middle order. Although he never had a big score, his responsible batting saw him involved in some of the biggest partnerships of the year. He is a superb fieldsman and I feel if Adrian had more confidence in his own ability he would improve even further. It will be interesting to see how he comes up next year.

Describing Freddie Rosser's year is interesting. Each time he managed to get his score into double figures he made at least 50. This was Fred's debut year in the 'A' grade and if he can develop his game so that he becomes more consistent, then he may well solve an opening batting problem for the future. A very hard hitting batsman who can change the whole complexion of a game in quick time, he improved his fielding as the season went on and I'm looking to him for even further improvement next year.

How fortunate is our club to have a man like David Elliott involved. Unfortunately for David we found that there were times this season when we preferred to play him in the 'B's. His attitude and his performances were still excellent irrespective of which grade he played. He is a fine example of what a good clubman is all about and I feel sure he'll force his way into the top team as a permanent member shortly.

Darren McGlashan started the season off in 'A' grade and I'm sure he gained some invaluable experience. His performance against Teachers when he took 10 wickets for the match was excellent. I feel if Darren can get more mentally tough, coupled with some intensive practise, we could have an extremely talented fast bowler for a long time to come.

Adam Catford also started the season off in the 'A's. Adam, I feel, needs a lot of match practise for his art of leg spin bowling, but unfortunately for him he wasn't getting it in the top grade. It is important for him to do a lot of constructive bowling at practise and also not to be so severe on himself when he bowls a poor ball. At this stage with that attitude he is his own worst enemy. He is a useful batsman and has the potential to develop into quite a good player and he is also a brilliant fieldsman.

Paul Edwards has the ability to be a very good player in the top grade. At this stage however he lacks the consistency to do so. In the latter part of the season he was hitting the ball extremely well and I'm looking to "Eddy" to play a big part in

the future of our club. Once again like to many of the young players in the club he is an excellent fieldsman.

Chris Price and Ian Harry were the two other players to play in the senior side this year. They each played only 1 game when we had a number of people unavailable due to representative commitments.

No report on this team would be complete without mentioning the non-playing members. I refer, of course, firstly to Murray Churchett who without doubt would be the best "ger" in Adelaide and secondly to Barry Sheldon, the best scorer in the game. Also to Peter Moyle who stood in for Barry when he was on representative duty. I must also mention John Ramage who scored at Prospect early in the season and hasn't let anyone forget that he is the only undefeated scorer in the club. My special thanks to all these people for their support and help during the year.

Finally, as you all are aware, I have played my last game. I left my home city of Wollongong in N.S.W. in 1970 where I had played all my cricket with the Corrimal Club, to join Adelaide. With that club I was fortunate to play in several premierships and I also was a member of Adelaide's last 'A' grade premiership side in 1974/75. There is no better feeling than playing in a successful team and I'm confident that we are on the right road to achieve that goal.

I see the next few seasons as the most exciting in the club's history, providing that people are prepared to work hard. I would like to thank everybody in the club for the support that was given to me during the season and I'm looking forward to being involved again next year.

A huge task faced Adelaide Cricket Club this season and I feel most players accepted the challenge and a rewarding and quite successful season was had.

The 'E' grade team was part of this success, by not only participating in the finals for the first time for many years, but by generally playing with a lot of determination and desire to win games. The overall attitude and the way the side played like winners for most of the season was a credit to the twenty two players who represented it, and my thanks go to all of them for their efforts.

The highlight of the season was the semi-final and it was a thrill for all who played in it but to tie and miss out on the grand final was extremely disappointing.

One of the reasons we made the finals was the improvement in the batting department, where batsmen were prepared to build a big innings. Graham Carthew's hundred and his renewed confidence in himself was most pleasing and hopefully he will go on to even better things next season. A couple of blazing innings by Geoff Rosser which resulted in his promotion and a superb innings by Paul Edwards against Student Teachers in which he unluckily missed his century were among the batting highlights.

A sensational 10 wicket, wicket-keeping haul by Mark Griffin against Woodville was possibly the outstanding individual effort of this season. His overall performance and improvement this season were excellent and if he continues in the same vein will make a fine 'A' grade player or better.

Treasurer's Report.

The financial accounts of the Adelaide Cricket Club show very much the year of 1982/83, as one of survival. While on the field performances improved, this is not reflected in the financial position of the club.

In presenting the accounts this year I have compared the 81/82 figures with the 82/83 accounts and prepared a budget/forecast for 1983/84. I feel that the forecast/budget is necessary to give the club some financial direction.

This budget reflects an increase in subs for seniors from \$60. to \$80., for non-players from \$5. to \$10., and for juniors a scheme whereby they pay \$25. to become a member of A.C.C. and then a \$1. per week match fees to play, this being necessary due to an excess of juniors and some play irregularly. This increase may seem large but two factors must be considered.

- a) There was no increase in the 82/83 season and since the 81/82 season costs have increased approximately 25%.
- b) Of the subs paid \$5. will go towards each member becoming a member of Bailey Sports Club. Therefore upon membership of the Adelaide Cricket Club members will automatically become members of Bailey and be entitled to use the club's facilities (e.g. the bar). Therefore the real increase of \$15. reflects only a 25% increase equivalent to the increase in costs

The budget also targets that the Tri-Colours raise \$5,000. and therefore support for their functions will be required. Support was there in 1981/82 but was lacking in 1982/83.

In order to purchase the heavy roller for the curator we require \$2,000.; the walk-a-thon has raised approximately \$800. so far, and therefore a further \$2,000. will be required to be raised in 1983/84, some of this will come from walk-a-thon money not yet collected. Kim Harris should be congratulated on his efforts so far but more work is required in 1983/84.

This budget also shows that we will have a shortfall of some \$1,000. and this money will have to be raised in some manner during the season ahead.

This budget does not take into account any costs of ground movements or ground hire costs which may be incurred in 1983/84. It is also assumed there will be no Bailey shortfall costs and during the six months the Cricket Club runs the Bailey Sports Club it will meet its commitments and not incur a loss.

Returning to the 1982/83 season's financial position it will be noted that the accounts have been closed a month earlier; this has been done so that the cricket clubs accounts close at the same time as the club relinquishes control of the Bailey Sports Club (end of March).

One of the major costs in the 1982/83 season was the Bailey shortfall of approximately \$3,000. and hopefully with the new system operating as mentioned above, this cost will not be incurred again.

In conclusion, I hope that firstly the club continues its success on the field; secondly that the administration improves as it has shown this past year and hopefully included in this improvement will be a better understanding of the financial aspects of the club and that for all out-goings, in-comings are required.
