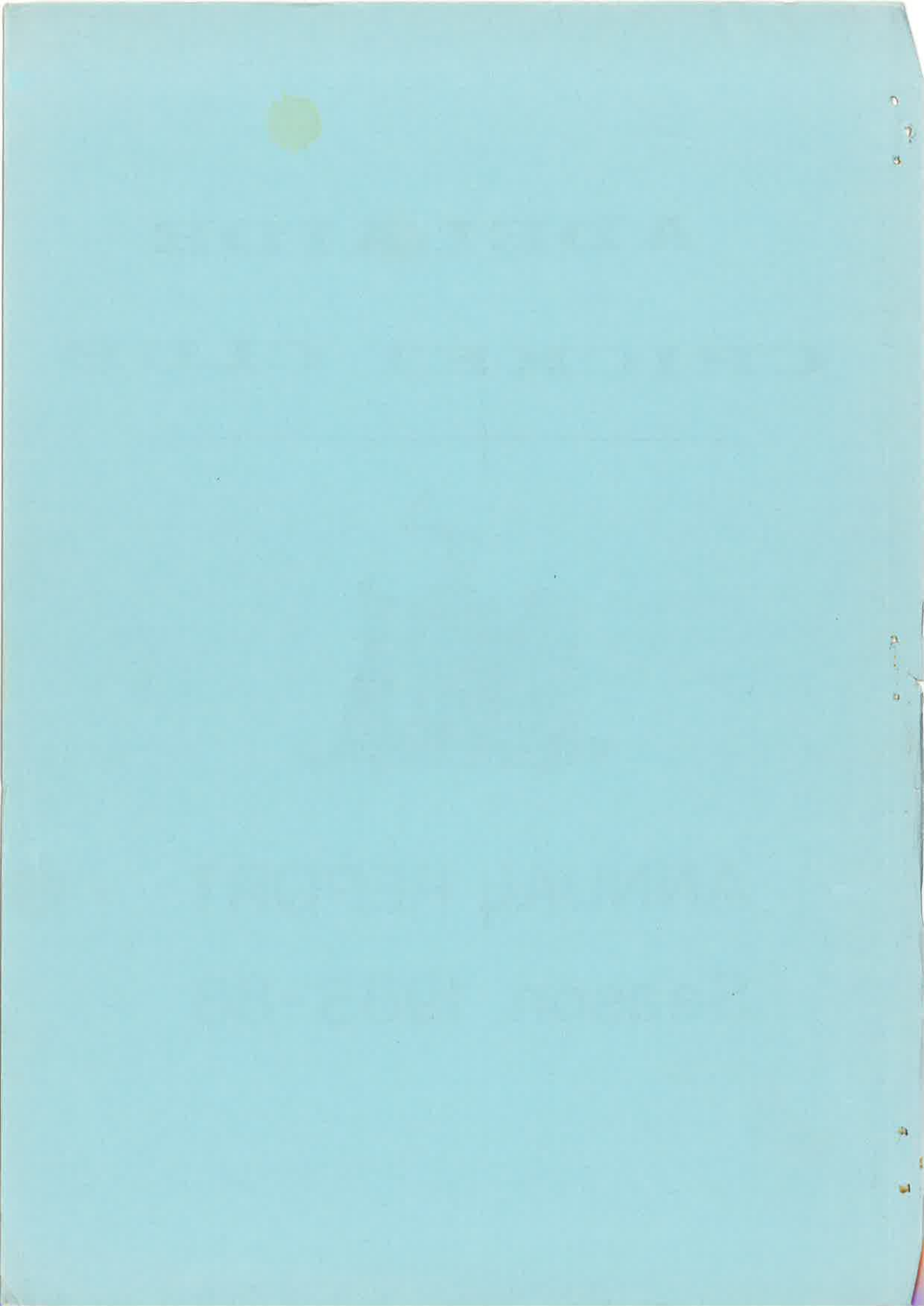

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

To look at the end of season premiership table one could expect some joy at finishing fifth from two years at the bottom. What is more important is to take notice of the way we finished fifth, knowing that only three rounds from the end of the season we were enjoying top spot and in the space of these three rounds, by losing each game, slid from top to fifth. The addition of world class batsman Gordon Greenidge for the first 8 rounds set the season up for us and his endeavours enabled us to win most early games. His recall to the West Indies in early January was a blow as we were expecting him to be here until the end of the month. However, his participation in seven games (one washed out) and activities at Bailey gave those players who were willing to observe and even learn; some of the routine of how a truly professional player goes about his business. Gordon's participation in the "Coca-Cola Coaching School" was truly amazing and his desire to coach as many children as possible did not in any way dilute his desire to adequately attend to each pupil in turn. We also had other overseas players, namely Chetan Chauhan who tirelessly coached the club and led the "A" grade and Peter Hartley from Yorkshire.

I have heard and had some conversation in recent months about whether we should accommodate overseas players at the obvious exclusion of our own local players. I don't believe that a definite yes or no answer can be generated as circumstances must be examined. If the club has a need of "A" grade players and there aren't any coming forward from the "B's" then we have no choice but to recruit, we can do this by two ways:

1. An obvious source of players is other clubs and their "A" grade players may be fair game, this isn't always as easy as it sounds - why would established players want to change clubs? As we don't pay players at Adelaide they may well be disadvantaging themselves, if they wish to change clubs for personal reasons is it because their own nature has caused a rift? and why won't it happen here? If they have changed residence and are now qualified to play for us then they certainly should and transfer procedure is simplified which brings another point in recruiting players locally, we may well woo the players we want but unless they get a clearance from their existing club it is to no avail.
2. Recruiting from overseas is a different matter as in most cases the players are not playing for their own clubs during our season. This is obviously a short term answer for players as the real solution is to "grow our own", but those youngsters need to mix with good players while they are learning and overseas players of the right caliber may achieve this. The final point about taking overseas players is made when we have our own lads playing elsewhere during our winter. Shouldn't we have fair exchange?

The finances have suffered a little this year and the financial report will reflect an operating loss for the season. This isn't as serious as may be thought and some hard work pre-season will get us back into the black.

The main cause of the loss was Gordon's contract which called for a payment in English pounds, the conversions were calculated, the costs estimated and sponsorship sought and won. When we were locked in irrevocably, the Australian dollar decided to become worthless, hence more payment than budgeted for and this attracted more tax than expected. I still believe the operation was worth while.

It was disappointing to have 6 of our 9 teams make the finals and not get a winner. This further supports my thoughts that we must change direction, to have the lower 6 of our teams consistently making finals yet we couldn't find one new face to break into "A" grade means we are still doing something wrong. The committee has been working hard to come up with a new formula for next year and I think we can now take that new direction.

Thanks to all the workers who have helped run the club this year. Our umbrella is ever widening and this causes more pressure on people to achieve more work, somehow this is happening but not without the key motivational people who have "grasped the nettle with both hands" and concentrate on doing their job to the best of their ability.

COACH'S REPORT:

Chetan Chauhan.

I took up the job from Ashley Woodcock as coach, and worked on where he left. Players of all the grades worked very hard and as a result the club had tremendous success. A & B grades just failed to qualify for the finals, "D" qualified "E" just missing out with "C" finishing runners up and "D" losing in semi-finals.

Serious training at indoor nets started in August and outdoor in September. My primary aim was to inculcate discipline amongst the players which I thought was less when I played a season before. Players were made to train up to late in the evening so that every one of them got a share of bowling, batting and fielding. A lot of them were shy of fielding but were forced into it. For batsmen and bowlers, I took extra nights to give them extra hits and more length of time. Most of the time I stressed concentration while batting and bowling, with words like, "Play as if you are playing in the match" and "Do not get out even at training". In bowling the essence was on action and follow-through. Quite a few fast bowlers as a result started to swing the ball. A lot of players started very well but took it easy and became complacent. Due to this, they faltered and finished in lower grades.

A very significant fact to note was that quite a few players were promoted into higher grades this year. I am sure they would settle down during the next season and establish themselves as cricketers of "A" grade. Another important thing was the attitude to win by the higher grades. I am sure this will develop a positive attitude amongst the players to play to win and not play for the sake of playing. This change came from the service of Gordon Greenidge who was the star of the club.

Due to certain problems we could not play more mid-week games but such games should be encouraged by the club as they will be very helpful especially to players who are out of form. It was heartening to see the bowlers bowled so well this season in all the grades. Fielding has considerably improved. It is only the batting which is a problem. With youngsters being promoted and the players like Greenidge playing for the club and batsmen realising their potential, I am sure it will click the following year, resulting in further success of the club. The club has made significant progress and now it is for the players to work harder in all departments of the game to consolidate what has been achieved this year.

In the end I thank the Committee for giving me the opportunity to coach the club. I also thank the captains and players for their support and co-operation. Lastly I show my appreciation to our new curator Daryl Ryan for the excellent job he did in maintenance of the ground and preparation of wicket.

"A" GRADE REPORT.

The season started with a bang with the "A" grade winning the first five games. It is a pity that we were not aggressive enough to qualify for the finals after being at the top throughout the season except for the last two games.

The main reason for faltering was our batting, as we were not able to score 300 runs on one single occasion. To our ill luck we played the last three games at Park 25 where the wicket was very flat. This blunted our attack which was our main strength. Batting in general was inconsistent and a few players who started the season so very well relaxed and were ultimately dropped to the lower grade. Due to the failure of senior players, batting order could not be fixed till late in the season, but it was heartening to see youngsters being promoted into "A" grade. Outstanding success out of these was Mark Griffin. I am sure he will improve further and be a player of the future in the club. At the same time, it is a worry that besides Greenidge none could score a century. The main reason is that batters are not hungry enough for runs, and are contented with 50's and 60's.

Bowling was our main strength and it was great to see that we bowled out all the sides except one during the season. Andrew Sincock, Ian Carmichael and Steve Trenorden and each took five wickets during the season. Sincock and Carmichael were the main bowlers and were very ably supported by Trenorden. It is only at Park 25 that the opposition could score over 250 runs against our attack, and it was only in the last game against Woodville that the bowlers strayed in line and length.

Ground fielding did improve but at times it was shabby especially in the air. We did drop catches at vital stages. Steve Gentle kept the wicket extremely well and took some brilliant catches. A bit of hard work will have to be put into it to raise the standard. Distance throwing has to be improved as well.

In general it was a very productive year having finished fifth. The pressure is on us to improve further, especially in batting and fielding. The habit of winning will have to be developed further, with more aggression, discipline and stubbornness to do well in hard situations.

Lastly I thank John Ramage for being the Manager and looking after us during the season. My thanks are also for the girls who served us afternoon tea and Barry for the Lucky coin which made me win 10 tosses and of course for scoring.

## B GRADE REPORT.

To describe the 1985-86 Season in B Grade, one word could be used - FRUSTRATION. At our best, we were very good and at our worst, very very poor. Inconsistency in most departments, but in particular batting led to the side's at times dismal performances.

The season started on a bright note with three wins in a row and some excellent performances. Paul Edwards 167 not out against Sturt at Adelaide No. 2 in the third game was the outstanding batting performance of the season and in B Grade Paul had an excellent season. Unfortunately, Paul could not get it together in A Grade and this was disappointing.

Darren Marsh started like a house on fire and looked set for promotion and a good season with scores of 87 and 41 not out. Unfortunately Darren received a serious eye injury and did not play again until Christmas but he couldn't recapture his early season's form.

Darren Chyer was promoted to the side and bowled extremely well with a very good 5/18 against East Torrens being a highlight, but he too gained a shoulder injury which virtually put paid to his season.

These injuries were part of the frustrations. Inconsistency followed the first three games of the season with the side only once putting two wins in a row together for the rest of the season. Our performances culminated in the last game of the season against the BOTTOM side, with one of the most gutless efforts I have seen from an Adelaide side. Chasing 163 we lost 8/90 in an hour and a half of inept batting which cost us a place in the finals. I was ashamed to be a member of the side on this performance and I wondered if the players, apart from not having pride in their Club had any pride in themselves.

Apart from all this, there were some outstanding individual performances during the year. Greg Aldam and Mark Griffin with some consistent performances, the highlight being Greg's 117 against Pt. Adelaide, were promoted to A Grade and it was most pleasing to see them succeed as an opening pair. I hope they go on with it next season.

Andrew McIntyre's return to the Club was welcomed and he found a couple of good scores, including a good 75 against Glenelg. Darren Gray put together some swashbuckling innings but he too was inconsistent. The pleasing thing about Darren this season was his bowling and fielding improvements and if he is prepared to work at it, he could be an excellent allrounder for our A Grade.

The outstanding bowling performance came from Peter Hartley with 7/28 off 18 overs against Woodville. Rauf Choudhry's return to the side for the last four games was very pleasing. He bowled with a lot of heart, some fire and a good line and length to capture 13 wickets in these games; something he couldn't do early in the year

Apart from Trevor Neate's 6 wicket haul in the last game the spinners were disappointing, seemingly lacking penetration and confidence. Phil Jeffrey's fielding was of the highest order and at times was exceptional. Unfortunately his batting was extremely inconsistent. Phil has enormous potential as a cricketer but until he concentrates and works harder on his game he might not release this ability.

The most pleasing aspect of the season for me was the performance of our young wicketkeeper, Warren Smith. Apart from his 32 catches and 1 stumping, his general glove work improved as the season went along. His mature attitude and whole outlook to his cricket is good. He obviously has goals and is prepared to work for them. He is an outstanding prospect for the future and a lot of cricketers in this Club could take a leaf out of his book and perhaps instead of making excuses, their cricket would improve.

There are many people to thank during a season of cricket, and I apologise if I miss anyone. Firstly a newcomer to our team, Hank Middleton who took on the thankless Manager's job. On behalf of the players and myself, many thanks for your enthusiastic efforts and I hope you continue with us next season.

The evergreen Bob Sage did a magnificent job AGAIN as scorer and I just hope we can perform better next season and give you the results you like to see. Many thanks Bob. My personal thanks to Don Leske for his back-up and thoughts during the season as our unofficial vice-captain. To our little band of supporters and in particular the ladies, many thanks for your loyal and vocal support which was appreciated by all players. We were very spoilt by our afternoon tea ladies and my thanks for your delicious efforts. Our practice captain Bert Griffin deserves many thanks for his untiring efforts at training.

Congratulations are in order for our new curator, Darrell Ryan, whose "workaholic" efforts have brought our practice and playing wickets up to a very good standard and I know all players in the Club have appreciated your efforts. Well done.

In conclusion, I hope our players will strive for more consistent performances from themselves, stop making excuses for their poor efforts by blaming everything except themselves, and work harder for success. By doing this we might achieve the success that the Club deserves from the undoubted ability that exists amongst our players.

## "C" GRADE REPORT

After losing only one minor round game and finishing minor premiers, it was to say the least disappointing to lose our second consecutive grand final.

Unfortunately, for the second year running we ("C" and "D" grades) were forced to play on a wicket which was not suitable to any grade of cricket and at times was extremely dangerous. Until such time as a good standard wicket is acquired, we as a club, will not be able to produce good "A" and "B" grade cricketers. A wicket such as Panther Park or Jack Fox makes it nearly impossible for a "B" grade player who has been dropped, to regain form, and for a young player on the way up, it must be an almost terrifying experience seeing more senior and experienced players hit about the head and upper body.

Looking back over the season, we at times played to our potential, and then on some occasions we struggled with bat, ball and hands. Perhaps highlighting this was our two games Vs Port Adelaide in the third last and last rounds of the year. We defeated them outright in the first confrontation, bowling them out in 17 overs with great catching and outstanding bowling by Paul Regan. In our second encounter, two weeks later, Port Adelaide were reeling at 5/8 (Regan starring again) and then proceeded to put down four catches on the trot. Had the side been able to "finish off" opposition sides, I doubt whether anyone would have made over 100 runs against us.

### Batting

Performances with the bat were inconsistent and only on a few occasions did we bat to our potential and amass large scores. The main problem was losing three or four wickets within an hour or so and thus putting great pressure on middle and lower order batters to do the job. Mick Harris deserved the batting trophy with excellent performances during the season. John Pearce came of age following his century in the third round, and those who witnessed his 87 in the semi-final would realise the future John has with the club. I believe both players will be part of our "A" grade line-up in the not too distant future. Darren McGlashon put in some top efforts with his dashing style and aggressive approach. Chris Peacock batted with his usual dedication and determination. This was highlighted when having retired hurt with a broken foot, Chris later returned to the crease with a runner and ended up 60 n.o. at plays end. Perhaps a few of our "young stars" should take a leaf out of his book. It would be remiss not to mention Bruce Worthington, Paul Regan and Keith Foster who all put in good work at the crease at various times. Their semi-final effort was outstanding.

### Bowling

Bowling was our strength throughout the season. When you consider 203 was the highest total scored against us (in the grand final) it gives some indication of how the bowlers performed. Keith Foster again won the bowling award for both the club and the S.A.C.A. and is to be congratulated on this achievement. Keith has been so successful in "C" grade that perhaps it is now time to try him at a higher level. Darren McGlashon bowled without a great deal of luck, but still gave his all when some blokes would have thrown in the towel with frustration. Darren's ability is greater than that of "C" grade level and he will force his way to higher grades shortly. Bruce Worthington spent

most of the year fluctuating between "B" and "C" grade, however, his performance in "C" grade was always consistent and his ability to bowl economically makes things a lot easier for his captain. Paul Regan's early form was poor, seeing him come down from "A's" to "C's". Paul's determination and will to succeed saw him re-capture form and bowl as we know he can. His efforts were rewarded with the only ten wicket haul of the season.

### Fielding

Adam Kennedy played his first season of district cricket this year and performed with distinction. This season's experience would have helped Adam immensely and he will be a more confident and knowledgeable keeper next year. Geoff Rosser and Darren McGlashon were nothing short of outstanding in the slip cordon. Their catching had to be seen to be believed. However, if we held all catches that came our way, the side's performance would have been staggering. Overall our ground fielding was solid and reliable.

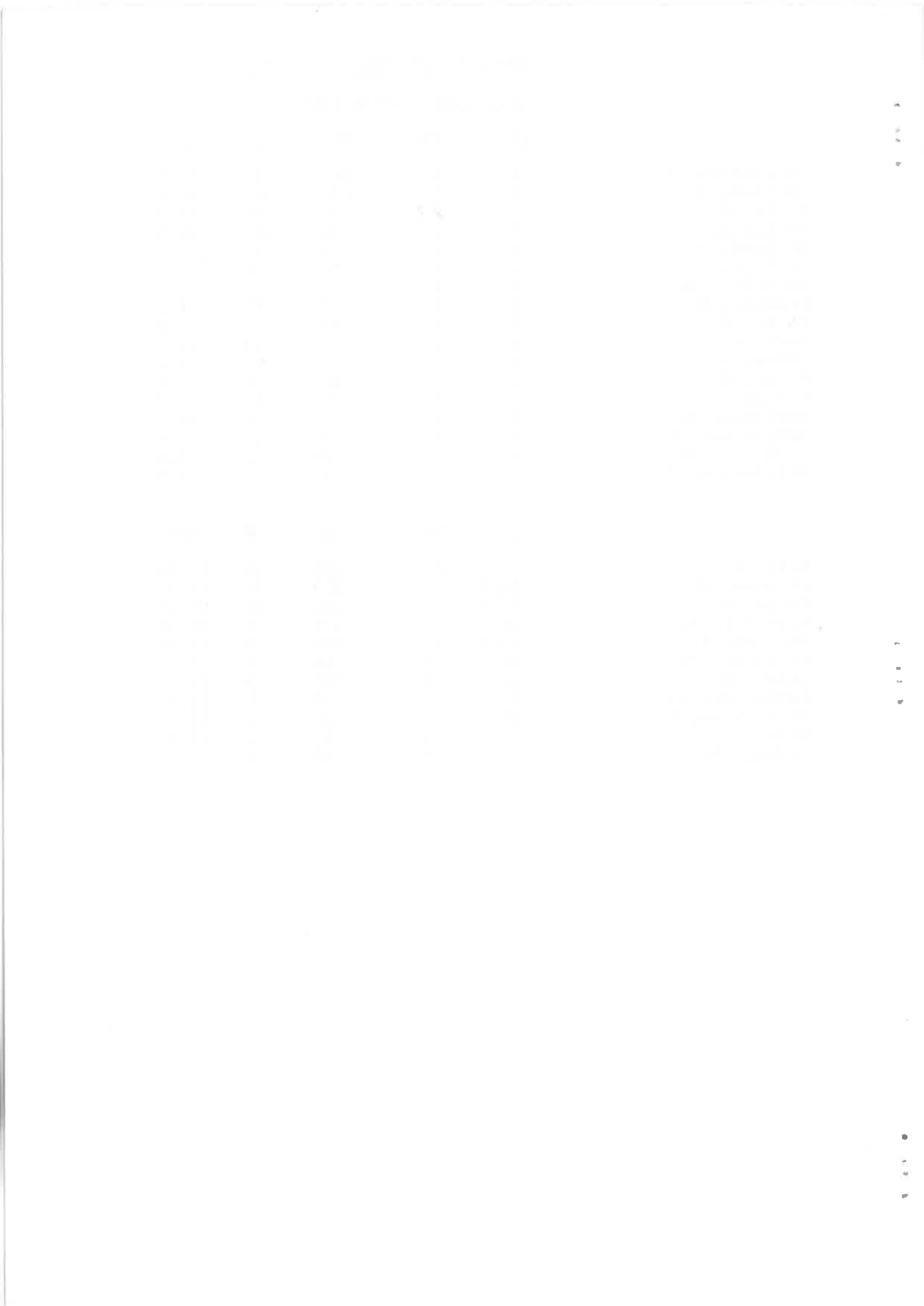

TREASURERS REPORT

1. I herewith present the Statements of Receipts and Expenditure together with a financial summary for the year ended 31st March, 1986 of the Adelaide Cricket Club Incorporated.
2. From perusal of the Expenditure Statement it can be seen that \$72461. 54 was spent over the past year to which must be added an amount of \$10081. 00 (est.) shown under (A) in the Financial Summary and which represents total expenditure of \$82542. 54 (approx) for the year.
3. The Receipts statement reveals a total income of \$69009. 82 plus \$3268 since received as shown under (B) in the Financial summary. This shows an overall deficit balance of \$10264. 72, but this is reduced by the sum of \$3537. 61 in Tricolours, and an excess in the bar account of approximately \$2000. 00.
4. The Clubs Management Committee restricted the purchase of Air Conditioning this year due to the non-availability of funds.  
The purchase of balls this year has far exceed the budget figure of last year, and a tighter control should be initiated next year for the distribution of this article. New nets were purchased at a cost of \$2581.00, and this was a far greater cost than the original figure of \$900. 00.  
I recommend that as new equipment was purchased this year for all kits, that no further equipment be purchased next year, with perhaps the exception of helmets - 1 for each kit
5. The cost of hiring ovals was lower than last year, and half the cost of Jack Fox Oval was waived due to our involvement in the competition for the physically handicapped organised on our behalf by Tony Wells. Thank you for your time and efforts Tony.
6. A large factor in the large deficit has been the visit ( although great for the Club) of Gordon Greenidge. Although sponsorship was received from Coca-Cola to the tune of \$30,000. 00 this has proved to be inadequate. Due to insufficient information being obtained at the commencement of his visit, we now have to pay Income Tax of approximately \$6000. 00.
7. To conform with method adopted over recent years presentation of the financial statements I have prepared a budget for the 1986/87 season. Bearing in mind that whilst a Budget is a valuable aid to keeping the Club on an even keel financially, it is sometimes difficult to achieve.
8. As can be seen from the prepared budget, in order to keep the club on the right side of the ledger twelve months hence, it is going to require the players to take an increasing responsibility for raising funds over and above their efforts this year, while greatly appreciated, if the club is to remain viable financially.
9. Two areas of fund raising, namely grant from S.A.C.A. and player/non player membership are essential to the survival of all clubs, and bear mentioning.

A successful fund raiser this year, with little effort, was the chocolate drive, achieving an amount of \$1348. 70, and I would recommend that this be carried out again next year.

At this point I must also point out the added saving (approx. \$700,00.) of catering for Presentation Night from within the Club rather than have outside caterers and waitresses, and on behalf of the club members I would like to thank June Hargreaves for the organising and the ladies of Tricolours for their part in this, together with the sisters of players who aptly served the meals.

In general terms, once again the Club has shown that it has been a matter of survival financially speaking and if it wasnt for the efforts of a few, namely Ian Harry with early sponsorship, Bob Farrell for organising the coaching clinics, Tony Wells for the raffles/wheel on a Saturday evening, and the ladies of Tricolours for their untiring efforts organising the meals etc. With reference to the Saturday evening meals it was very disappointing to see that their efforts were not appreciated by more patrons partaking of same.

In closing I would like to give special thanks to my wife June for her backing during the past twelve months and Shirley Wells for being the errand girl when banking was required to be done during my working hours. I shall not be standing for Treasurer in the coming year, and would like to wish every success to the club in the 1986/87 season.
