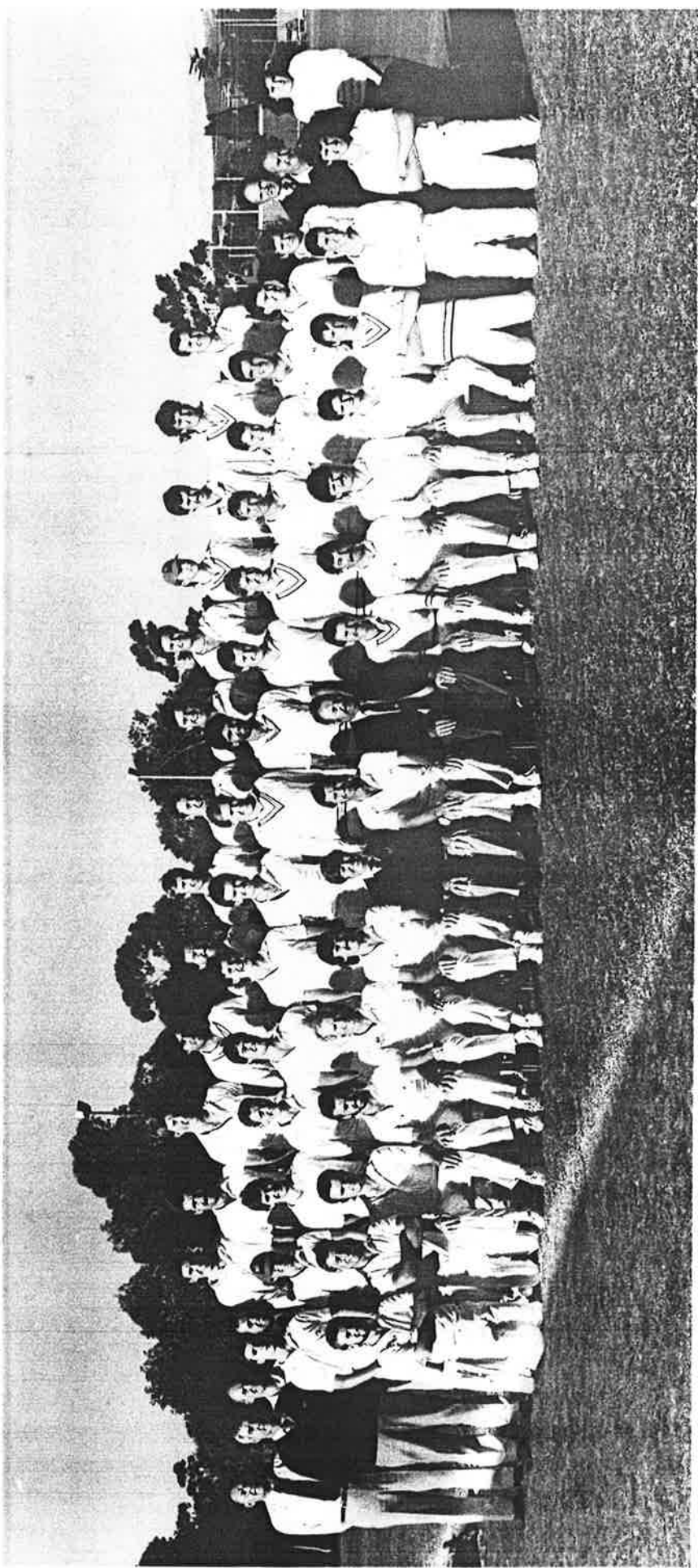

## PRESIDENTS REPORT

Members,

Season 87/88 turned out to be more successful than we would have hoped for. Not only did we win the Club Championship, but the 'A' Grade finished third in both minor and major rounds, the 'B's' and D's both qualified for the finals without success and in the Junior grades both Under fourteen SACA and Turf qualified with only the Turf side making the Grand Final and going down to Edwardstown. Our 'A' Grade performance was very pleasing, as we now have eleven players who have played an 'A' final and I believe have the desire to be there again next year with a burning desire to be successful. Significantly the Club Championship means strength throughout the four senior grades, and with the knowledge that youth predominates in all grades, the experience gained this season should serve us well for the future.

Congratulations to our state representatives Darren Chyer (Mc.Donalds Cup State Team), Darren Marsh, Tim Pillion (Second Eleven), Warren Smith (Under Nineteen State), Trent Milford (Under Seventeen State), Damian Kitto (captain) and Michael Pomeroy (Shell Team of the Year), Also SACA trophy winners Darren Chyer ('A' Grade Bowling Ave.), Chris Davies ('C' Grade Bowling Agg.), Rod Hook and Jason Maraun ('D' Grade Batting and Bowling).

It is with a great deal of pleasure that I advise the reappointment of Peter Williams as Club Coach. I reported last year that we are achieving management stability, it is my feeling that we are now arriving at coaching stability, and with the band of true Adelaide players we are generating, the future looks good. Since the last annual report Shane Bernhardt was invited to attempt to attain Level Three Coaching Credibility, he achieved this with honours and is now one of the small band of Level Three Coaches in Australia.

Sponsorship became a larger part of club finances this season, and we thank our major sponsors Kirra Tours, Ramsay Airconditioning, B.S. Stillwell Ford, Bone Timber Industries and West End (via SACA). Other sponsors (listed elsewhere), helped us with individual player's sponsorships and man of the match awards, and these people are included in our thanks. John Ramage is to be thanked for his input into gaining Sponsors.

Facilities at Bailey Reserve have been upgraded with the steel wire enclosure of the Stillwell Ford Junior Practice area, further improvements to this area are planned for the coming season, as are plans to replace several centre turf pitches. The diesel roller had major repairs and this item should not need attention for many years. We have installed a steel wire cage in the storeroom at Bailey and this means we can safely store club property on the premises.

Tricolours ran a very comprehensive social program and was disappointed with the lack of support from club members. It takes a great deal of effort to organize the number, and to the quality of the functions held and when thirty too few people attend questions have to be asked as to whether it is all worthwhile. Belonging to a club means a lot more than just turning up to practice and playing on Saturday, players are expected to be proud of their club and support it as much as possible. We had a past versus present cricket match and we were lucky enough to be able to assemble eight of the last premiership team to play our current 'A' grade, the tie was a fitting result for such a great day.

Last years layoff from using Jack Fox oval together with our decision to prepare the pitch area this year was justified by the pitch quality down there this season, we will be persuing a further agreement with Minda for continued use of this ground. We also thank Don Mc.Glashan for his involvement with our sponsored (Premier) team in the Intellectually Disabled competition. We also thank Bert Griffin for the enormous effort he contributed to help Darryl Ryan in the preparation of centre and practice wickets at Bailey.

Bar turnover was fairly stable, being similar to last year. The lack of attendance at most of the functions has its effect here, but we still managed a considerable financial support to the club. John Wilson spent many hours managing the bar and we thank him for his effort.

Thanks to all the workers who have helped run the club this year, and I must make special mention of the Country Carnival, which was superbly catered for both on and off the field to an acknowledged standard by the country players, and also gave club finances a much needed boost.

Finally I predict that we are entering an exciting period and look forward with anticipation to next season.

## A GRADE REPORT

It's hard to describe the season that we just had in a few words, but i'll try my best. We started the season knowing that we had improved from the previous season but what has become all too common, down on a few personnel. The selection committee decided to back the youth in the club and started the season with a very inexperienced side. However, I'm glad no one told this to the lads as we started very competently drawing our first game then winning the next two. Our players grew in stature and confidence throughout the season and settled into a style of play that I liked. If there is one thing that disturbs me is that throughout the year we didn't win three games in a row, but I'm sure this would have been different if we had got a start in the last game against University.

Our final results for the year were six victories including one outright, three drawn and three lost. This proved enough for us to make the four for the first time in some twelve odd years. Very pleasing indeed. Unfortunately we were not good enough in the semi, going down to West Torrens by some forty odd runs. The signs are good for the future providing we are prepared to work twice as hard next year, because with this application the ultimate is not very far away.

When you think we did this when we didn't all fire at one time barring the Prospect game is truly encouraging. The other exciting factor is the 'B' Grade are producing a number of potential 'A' Graders and I hope they maintain the pressure and push for a place next year.

I personally believe the reason for our successful season was the resurgence of our batting for the first time in many years. I can't remember the last time we had three players in one season make over five hundred runs, and four centuries were scored. At this stage I would like to congratulate Darren Marsh on topping the batting honours. He now has completed his second season and with a little more consistency should make a bundle of runs in the future. Andrew Ramage finally showed some of his ability and produced a fine consistent season, something that has been lacking in the past. Five hundred runs plus is a fine effort and one can only hope for many repeat seasons in the future. We then had a number of players who performed but probably not as often as they would have liked. Phil Jeffery made some good scores and did enough for his first season. I believe he has the ability to improve greatly on this effort but that will only happen if he is prepared to knuckle down do the hard work. Andrew Mc.Intyre had his moments after a slow start as did John Pearce. All John needs is a big score but this will only come with a more positive outlook. Marty Clifton did not get many opportunities but has the chance next year to consolidate and I believe he will. Stephen Trenorden played a couple of fantastic knocks at the end of the season which showed his ability. He also had limited opportunities during the year. If I don't mention the next player who averaged over fifty for the year I'd get hung, so well played Tim Pillion.

The bowling is our strength led with a magnificent season by Darren Chyer which was topped off by his selection in the State Side. If he maintains this progress next year there will be no stopping him. Tim Pillion in his second season also bowled well and should benefit from his winter in England. Rauf Choudhry bowled well early and had a lean time just after Christmas but bowled without luck. Stephen Trenorden bowled well without getting many wickets but on a number of occasions slowed the scoring creating pressure and wickets at the other end. Unfortunately only a few people realize the importance of these efforts in a game. Phil Jeffery also did well and was used mainly as a partnership breaker and did not let his skipper down too many times. I must also mention Trevor Neate who did well with limited opportunities before his injury.

Our fielding improved and more catches were held than normal. However this is still an area we must improve on to create the pressure to win close games. We must also eliminate the error when a pressure situation arises.

Other players who played 'A' Grade and will put pressure on next year were Peter Harfield, Alan Davidson, Stuart Wells and Warren Smith.

In closing I would like to thank our Coach Peter Williams whose praises we have already sung and the winning of the Club Championship says it all. To my manager, John Ramage, scorers Barry Sheldon and Bert Griffin my heartiest thanks. To the best supporters around, my wife and children who put up with a lot, thanks for everything.

This year was a pleasure but I hope we all realize the hurt of losing a semi-final and work harder to go further next year. I am truly proud to be able to lead such a fine bunch of guys as I had this year and I look forward to next year with anticipation.

At a district cricket club level how should we measure success? Does winning minor grade premierships indicate success, does the winning of Club Championships indicate success or is it indicated by winning an A Grade Premiership.

Unfortunately I believe it to be the latter, and although we deservedly won this seasons Club Championship and celebrated this victory as a club, very little recognition was received from the cricketing public.

On the other hand we look at Salisbury Cricket Club, who won their second successive 'A' grade Premiership and note that this club received more than their fair share of recognition.

Certainly, when we look at Salisbury we see that they supported this achievement with a 'B' grade Premiership, but also note that their 'C' grade side have been considered the 'easy beats' of the competition over the past two seasons.

It is evident that Salisbury do not place the same emphasis on winning 'C' grade matches as do other clubs, but they do emphasise the development of their younger brigade of players at this level.

Since taking over the 'C' grade side at the commencement of the 1986/87 season, I can honestly say, performance wise, I had a very difficult act to follow. For a number of seasons our 'C' grade side had performed exceptionally well and consistently participated in the major round. Although this appeared to be very good on the surface, in reality we were only producing competitive 'C' grade cricketers and not providing the senior sides of the club with new playing personnel.

Although the level of performance of the 'C' grade side has reduced over the past two seasons, lets consider the following points:-

-Jamie Aitken, Alan Davidson and Marty Clifton progressed from 'C' grade at the commencement of the 1986/87 season to represent the club at an 'A' grade level.

-Erin Bernhardt, Trent Milford, David Midwinter, Craig Scott and Greg Jozwa progressed from the 'C's to represent the club at a 'B' grade level.

-We have provided the medal winner and a third place getter in the two years of the medals existence.

-Twelve new players were introduced to 'C' grade cricket during the 1986/87 season and a further fourteen players were introduced this season.

-On only one occasion this season did we have more than two players representing us over the age of 19.

-We missed the finals last season by .89% and this year won as many games as we lost.

Considering these facts I find it extremely difficult to comprehend how anybody can say that the 'C' grade side is not performing the functions that it should be.

During any season, individual performances stand out and none more so than the bowling feats of Chris Davies. Chris in his first year of district cricket captured an incredible 40 wickets at an average of 16 and provided he continues to approach his game in the same manner, he must surely be given the opportunity to represent the club at a higher level next season. Chris received excellent support from first year leg spinner Kevin Rimmer who took 26 wickets and new comer Ben Hook who claimed 14 wickets after being promoted from the 'D's just prior to Christmas.

Batting consistency appeared to be our only downfall this season and although I am sure that Tim Pearce, Darren Wesley, Geoffrey Hargreaves, David Midwinter and Erin Bernhardt not only appreciated the opportunity to play 'C' grade cricket, their game will definitely benefit from this season.

It is important that young players receive the opportunity and appropriate guidance when playing at a more senior level and I am certain that I provided the 'C' grade players with this during the season.

No amount of coaching can instil in players the sense of achievement gained when we routed a previously undefeated East Torrens for 98 after we made 8/240 the week before, or when we took 5/12 to defeat a third place Flinders University or when we scored 5/228 to defeat a fourth placed Sturt who boasted two former 'A' and 'B' grade opening bowlers.

I believe that if we analyse our performance in the correct context, we can see that the 'C' grade did play a major role in the performance of the club this season and I am sure that we will see some of these names performing in higher grades in the near future.

In closing I would like to wish the boys all the best for their future and trust that they benefitted from this season.

Also to Alison Bernhardt and Sharon Wheeler, I thank you for your support and understanding during the season as I could not have succeeded without you.

Once again, many thanks to Kel Bromley and Craig Burton of the Clubs Sport Store who provided me with excellent sponsorship.

Finally, to our loyal band of supporters, thankyou for your support and encouragement throughout the season.

I believe the D grade side can look back with pride at our achievements this year.

Firstly, I know the team gained a great deal of satisfaction from contributing, together with the other sides, towards the Club Championship. This achievement meant a lot to us all.

Secondly, it has been tremendous to see the advancement made by our players during the season. Most of our players were playing their first year of senior cricket; several were still eligible for the junior competition. I believe the Club can be proud of the way we supported our young cricketers at this level and of the way the boys responded to the opportunities they were given. We were more than competitive throughout the year, as demonstrated by our participation in the finals. I remain convinced that we had in our ranks as good a team as any playing in the D competition and given a fair opportunity in the finals we might just have proved that point.

Due to the number of young players in the side, I took upon myself this year the responsibility to bat up the order and give a lead in this area. As the year progressed it was particularly pleasing for me to see the way Martin Richards (269 runs at 29.9) and Alby O'Connor (201 runs at 33.5) developed into very reliable players at No. 3 and 5 respectively. Graham McDonald made some useful contributions with the bat, but with his limited opportunities due to a number of declarations towards the end of the year, we have only to this stage caught glimpses of the significant advances he has made over the season in his technique and approach. Statistics show that our opening batsmen, Richie Pearce and Andrew Fowler, did not have big seasons, but both players showed enough to convince me they have the ability to "make it" in the district scene. Valuable batting support during the year was provided by Jason Maraun (135 runs at 27.0), Michael Pomeroy and Andrew Piovesan. I also acknowledge the early season performances of Darren Wesley, Tim Pearce and Craig Scott which earned their promotion to the C grade side.

The mainstay of our bowling attack for the whole season has been Michael Pomeroy for pace and Jason Maraun with his leg spin. Early in the year Ben Hook (15 wickets at 13.7) provided the third prong in our "schoolboy" attack before he was promoted to C grade. Later in the year Shaun Richardson (18 wickets at 14.2) took over the role as our other main bowler. I give enormous credit to Michael Pomeroy (34 wickets at 14.4) for his work all year. It's been a good season for him. He may not have won the team's bowling trophy but he gained my admiration, if that is any consolation. The trophy for most wickets goes to Jason Maraun (39 wickets at 17.0). The most striking aspect of Jason's performance was that 33 of his wickets were obtained since Christmas at the outstanding average of 12.8. This is a clear demonstration of his development during the year in adjusting to adult cricket and turf pitches and I congratulate him on an excellent year's work.

The efforts put in by Andrew Piovesan behind the stumps were appreciated all year and his fielding trophy is well deserved. I knew from previous years that Andrew had the ability to keep well to the quicker bowlers but I was most impressed with his development this season in keeping to spin. His 9 stumpings for the season is evidence of his work in this area. Some excellent work in the field by Alby O'Connor, Martin Richards and Geoff Whitford also caught the eye on several occasions during the year.

My thanks go to John Richards (scoring), Roger McDonald (drinks), Rick Pomeroy and Renz Piovesan for their assistance in various ways throughout the year. I also thank the 'mums' who contributed teas and afternoon teas as required.

Our congratulations and thanks go to Peter Williams for an excellent year as Club Coach. I'm sure his interest, support and knowledge played a huge part in the development of our Club this year. I also extend my admiration and thanks to the Club Committee and the Tricolour Ladies for their huge input over the season.

Thank you to a great group of boys for the support you have given me this season. I hope you have enjoyed your year and I look forward with interest to watching your development through the higher grades.

TREASURERS REPORT

1. I herewith present the Statements of Receipts and Expenditure together with a financial summary of the year ended 31st March, Adelaide Cricket Club Incorporated.
2. From perusal of the Expenditure Statement it can be seen that \$43,456.53 was spent over the past year from which \$3000 can be deducted ( transfer to Investment A/C ) and to which \$8360.22 can be added ( shown under 'A' in the Financial Summary ) which represents a total expenditure of \$48816.75.
3. The Receipts Statement reveals a total income of \$39237.07 plus \$5446 since received or yet to come as shown under 'B' and 'C' in the Financial Summary. This shows an overall deficit of \$1723.88 but this can be offset by the sum of \$5129.61 in Tri-colours and approx \$1000 in the Bar Account.
4. It is pleasing to note that during the year agreement on Leasing arrangements was reached with the SARU. The outlay of funds at the beginning of the year for accounts not rendered during previous years has put quite a strain on financial resources this year. However, due to the new arrangements, we can now plan our budget for Ground expenses far more accurately.
4. It should be noted that a number of extra-ordinary expenses were incurred during the year. The expected grants for the Junior wickets were not forthcoming ( cost \$3400 ) and extensive repairs were needed for the diesel roller.
5. To conform with the method adopted over recent years in the presentation of the Financial Statement, I have prepared a Budget for the 1988/89 season. While at best it is a 'guesstimate' it is an aid to give us some idea of our Financial aims. One major item of expense is the sum ( approx ) of \$6000 for new Centre Wickets at Bailey.
6. One of the major sources of income this year was through our Major Sponsors and also Player Sponsorships ( both Junior and Senior ). The Club's Management Committee would like to thank all those who Sponsored the Club this year. By providing funds for better facilities and equipment, the success of the Adelaide Cricket Club will be enhanced, and, in being associated with a successful Club, our Sponsors will have an excellent vehicle for their promotion. The major raffle was also well supported this year with only a few books left unsold. With a little more effort we should be able to sell all books next year.

In closing I would like to thank all those who have supported the Club by providing time and materials in order to keep the running costs of the club down. An enormous amount of work is done on a voluntary basis. I believe that our financial stability will influence our success on the field and the support of ALL players and members will ensure that we are a successful Club.
