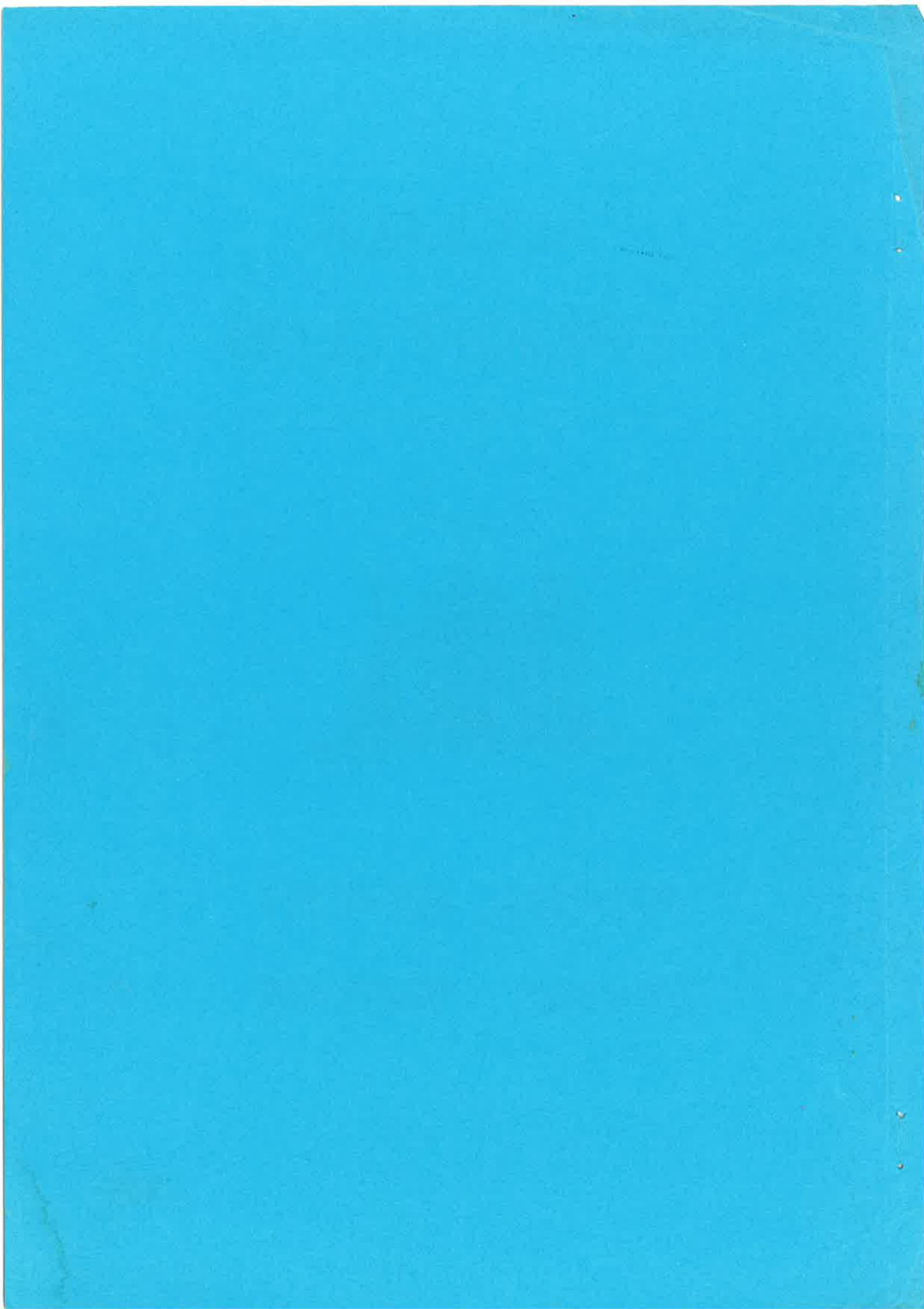

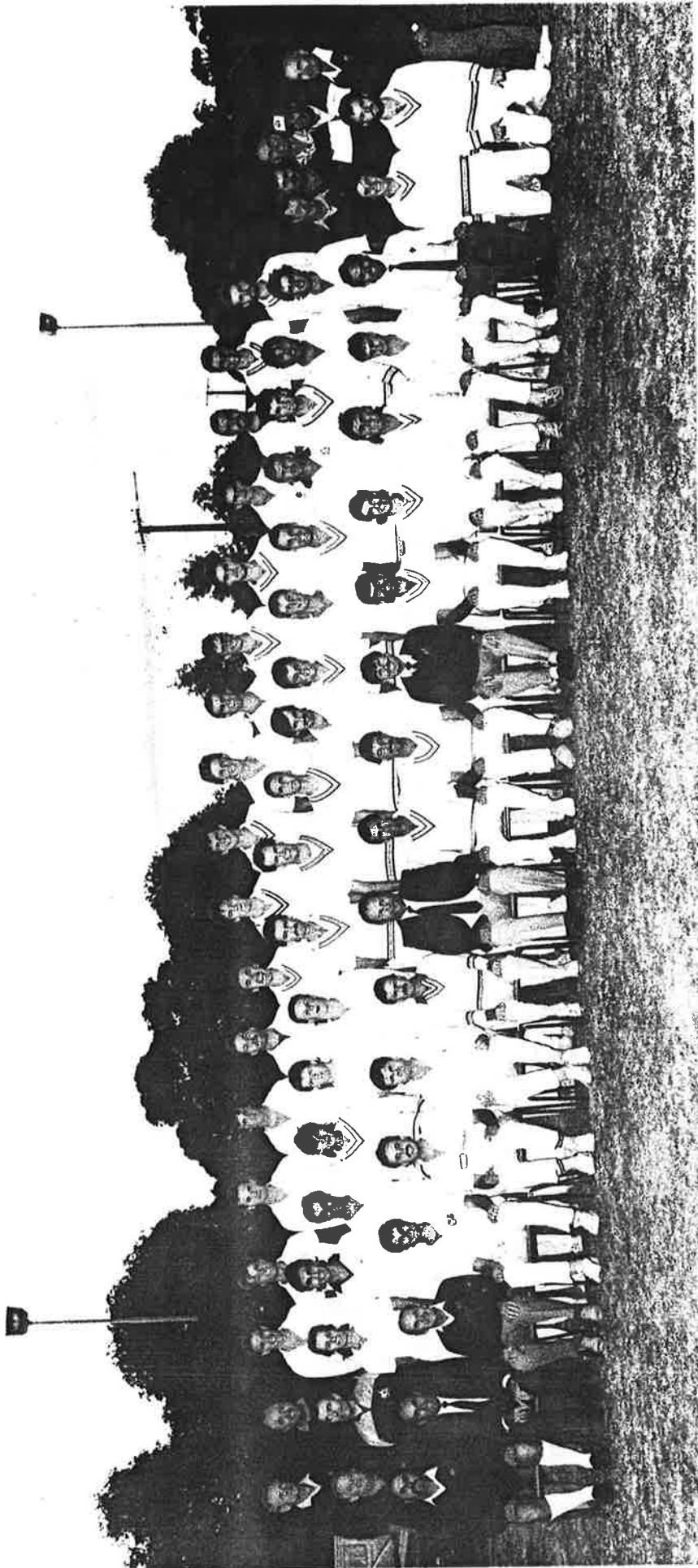
The playing facilities provided by curator Darryl Ryan were again first class and I thank Darryl for his effort in this regard.

## B GRADE REPORT

MY CONGRATULATIONS PETER, FOR YOUR WILL TO SUCCEED AND LARGE IMPROVEMENT IN YOUR FIELDING. STEWIE WELLS 30 ODD WICKETS TO TAKE OUT THE BOWLING WAS A FINE EFFORT AS WELL. AT TIMES STEWIE BOWLED VERY QUICKLY AND I FEEL IF HE SORTS OUT A COUPLE OF MINOR PROBLEMS, WHICH HE IS FULLY AWARE OF, HE WILL ESTABLISH HIMSELF IN THE A GRADE TEAM. TREVOR NEATE'S PERFORMANCE WITH BOTH BAT AND BALL ( OVER 300 RUNS AND NEARLY 30 WICKETS) WAS OUTSTANDING AND HE GUIDED THE TEAM OUT OF MANY STICKY SITUATIONS. MY THANKS TO TREVOR FOR YOUR EFFORTS AND SUPPORT.

CHRIS DAVIES ESTABLISHED HIMSELF IN THE SIDE THIS YEAR AND LOOKS TO HAVE A BRIGHT FUTURE WITH AN HONEST, HARD WORKING ATTITUDE TOWARDS HIS BOWLING. TRENT MILFORD, DAMIEN KITTO, KEVIN RIMMER AND BEN HOOK ALL SHOWED GLIMPSSES OF THINGS TO COME AND ALL COULD HAVE EXCITING FUTURES.

I MUST MENTION MARK GRIFFIN'S PERFORMANCE IN TAKING OVER THE GLOVES FROM WARREN SMITH WHEN HE WAS PROMOTED. HE DID A FINE CARETAKERS JOB WITH THE GLOVES AND I HOPE NEXT YEAR HE WILL BE ABLE TO CONCENTRATE ON HIS BATTING AND TURN IN EFFORTS LIKE HIS SEMI-FINAL INNINGS AND RE-ESTABLISH HIMSELF IN THE A GRADE SIDE.

## 'C' GRADE REPORT

"So near and yet so far" - words which may well echo the thoughts and feelings of a number of coaches, captains, players and supporters of the Adelaide Cricket Club.

To have seven sides competing in semi-finals of which six progressed to grand-finals, is certainly a tremendous feat. However, it was extremely disappointing that from these six grand-finals we were unable to secure a premiership and as we all well know - nobody remembers runners-up.

Certainly some of this disappointment is offset by the fact that we were once again Club Champions - a fact that I am sure we are all proud. However to follow this up with a premiership would have been the ultimate experience, an opportunity which doesn't come along all that often.

Looking at the 'C' Grade performance this season, it would be somewhat of an understatement to suggest we were struggling to stay in touch with four after the first eight rounds. At that stage of the season, we had recorded three wins and five losses, and although four of these losses were only small, they still appeared "on the debit side of the ledger".

A fighting win in round nine against second place Prospect, followed by convincing wins over Flinders University (third), University Black (ninth), and West Torrens (top) saw us sneak into the four by just over one point.

These wins didn't just happen, they were a result of a great deal of hard work and the perseverance of individuals to continue "plugging away" when things got tough. I am certain this is an area in which a number of players have developed and this should prove beneficial to them in the future.

It is history now that after easily accounting for West Torrens in the semi-final, we missed out in the one that counted against Glenelg. Grand-finals don't come along all that often and subsequently losing is difficult to accept. However, I am certain that the eleven 'C' Grade players who represented Adelaide in this match, benefited greatly from the experience, and can only look positively towards next season.

Although the 'C' Grade "resurgence" was somewhat of a team performance, it would be remiss of me not to mention some outstanding individual performances:-

- Ben Hook continued where he left off at the end of last season to be our highest wicket-taker at the end of the minor round. Ben's performances were well recognised by his inclusion in the victorious South Australian Under 17 Carnival Side and by his promotion to 'B' Grade for one game late in the season.
- Erin Bernhardt commenced the season in the 'C' Grade as a top order batsman who, if the situation warranted, could send down a few overs. An injury to Kevin Rimmer during our second game encounter against Tea Tree Gully left us one bowler short for most of the innings. Erin was given the opportunity in this game to act as a bowler which he grabbed with both hands. Erin must be well pleased with his season in not only being our top run scorer, but also tying with Ben Hook for most wickets at the end of the major round. His five wicket haul in the grand-final was a most memorable performance.



- Kevin Rimmer had a somewhat interrupted start to the season. He suffered a painful injury in the second round and after regaining fitness made his come-back through the 'D' Grade where he performed very well. He was quickly promoted back to the 'C's' where he continued bowling a very good line and length and was also becoming a handy down the order batter. Kevin was fortunate enough to be promoted to the 'B' Grade for two matches which I am certain will benefit him for the future. His 75 as a "make-shift" opener in our semi-final win against West Torrens was a highlight of his season.
- Andrew Piovesan was one of the few players who spent all of the season in our side. Although he was required to "keep" on some difficult wickets, his performances were encouraging. Andrew has a safe pair of hands and provided he is willing to work hard on his game, he can expect to be a big contributor to Adelaide's success in the future.
- Michael Pomeroy and Craig Scott always provided honest support in the bowling department and Martin Richards, Leith Dawes, Michael Wood and Michael Jones all indicated they have the ability and technique to perform at a higher level.

In closing I would like to thank the 'C' Grade players for their support and efforts during the season and wish them all the best for the future. I am certain they all learnt a great deal over the past six months.

Also many thanks to Kel Bromley and Craig Burton of the Club Sports Store who once again provided me with excellent sponsorship.

Finally, to our Manager Bob Bernhardt and scorer Robert Roach, I sincerely thank you for the manner in which you performed your roles. Also to our loyal band of supporters who followed the side each Saturday, thanks a million.

## S.A.C.A. 'D' GRADE REPORT 1989

For most clubs a berth in a cricket Grand Final, win or lose is rated as a measure of success. However the 'D' grade team, a majority of which consists of players under 19 years of age, were very disappointed to have lost the Grand Final after having lost only two minor round games. Over the 1989 season the team won 10 games and finished minor premiers, going on to win the semifinal against Sturt but not being quite good enough on the day to defeat Glenelg in the Grand Final. We offer our congratulations to the Glenelg Cricket Club on winning the 1989 'D' Grade Premiership.

No fewer than twenty two players were given the opportunity to represent the Adelaide Cricket Club at this level in an endeavour to test the abilities of a great range of young players. All players have shown improvement throughout the season and it would seem certain that the highs and the lows of the season will have been important experiences for the future development of the clubs' younger players.

The batting of the team throughout the season could generally be regarded as inconsistent. However, the team usually batted in a cavalier manner and not always technically correct whilst engaged in some exciting run chases that led to some outstanding victories. Nonetheless there were some excellent individual performances. In the third game of the season against the Sturt Cricket Club Martin Richards made a valuable and very well compiled 102 runs. This performance led to Martin being promoted to the 'C' Grade Team for the remainder of the minor round. Later in the season in the Semi Final against Sturt, Martin rescued the team from a rather perilous position with the most valuable innings of the season - 126 not out. Martin scored 305 runs at this level. Darren Bain, new to the club this season, from Port Pirie, contributed in the middle of the season with three important 50's in a row and 203 runs for the season. Andrew Fowler scored a century in an exciting game against Flinders University, with a carefully made 107. Another valuable innings was Stephen Lowry's 101 not out in the Grand Final when the team, at 6 for 34 appeared to be in danger of collapsing and being dismissed for a score below 50. This innings was exceptional because of the circumstances surrounding his selection. Stephens performances throughout the season were valuable and consistent if not spectacular. We congratulate Stephen on winning the 'D' Grade Batting Trophy with an aggregate of 392 runs.

The bowling at this level was never very dynamic, but was always reliable and steady. We were able to restrict the opposition to scores that the batsmen were able to make. Again there were some excellent individual performances during the season. Michael Jones deserves a special mention for his 21 wickets for the season, the 'hat trick' and 7 wickets for 8 runs against Port Adelaide, which was the most outstanding performance for the team. Mark Palmers' 7 wickets against Kensington at Jack Fox was a match winning performance. In the Semi Final, Sturt, after a very sound start, were looking as if they may score well over 350 runs, but Michael Pomeroy's 6 wicket performance prevented them from scoring any more than 264 runs. Michael took 17 wickets at this level as did Jason Maraun. The most consistent performance throughout the season however, was that of Kevin O'Shahnessy with 30 wickets. We congratulate Kevin on winning the 'D' Grade Bowling trophy for this season.

The fielding was always enthusiastic and effective. We rarely dropped catches and put the opposition under pressure with our quick movement to the ball and tight fielding. We congratulate Stephen Lowry on winning the 'D' Grade Fielding Trophy.

I would like to thank the members of the team for their enthusiastic approach toward the game and their support throughout the season. Thank you also to Mr. Z. O'Connor, Mr. J. Richards Mr. P. Maraun and Mr. R. Pomeroy for their valuable assistance and support. Thanks also to Peter Williams, Steve Gentle, Chris Price, Shane Bernhardt and Bob Farrell for their support and valuable advice throughout the season.

Finally I would like to congratulate Peter Williams on coaching the Club to another Club Championship and for leading the club into six Grand Finals.

TREASURERS REPORT

1. I herewith present the Statements of Receipts and Expenditure together with a financial summary of the year ended 31st March 1989, Adelaide Cricket Club Incorporated.
2. From perusal of the Expenditure Statement it can be seen that \$44,296.03 was spent over the past year an increase of approx. \$1000 from the previous year. To this should be added the sum of \$10790.92 representing accounts to be paid but presented after the cutoff date of 31/3/89.
3. The Receipts Statement reveals a total income of \$45689.03 plus \$8983.30 since received or yet to come as shown under 'B', 'C' & 'G' in the Financial Summary. Together with the value of Clothing on hand, the Club is showing an approximate credit balance of \$3106.94. The figure is approximate because some accounts have yet to be received.
4. It should be noted that I have made provision in these figures for repayment of debentures still held by the Club and also for Major raffle prizes as yet untaken. I have also included as an extra item the Sharpe Memorial Fund. Some of these have only come to my attention this year and must be included if we are to have an accurate picture of the Club's overall financial position.
5. To conform with the method adopted over recent years in the presentation of the Financial Statement, I have prepared a Budget for the 1989/90 season. While at best it is a 'guesstimate' it is an aid to give us some idea of our Financial aims. One major item of expense allowed for last year of \$6000 for new Centre Wickets at Bailey, was fortunately unnecessary due to the excellent work of our curator, Darryl Ryan and we are appreciative of his efforts.
6. One of the major sources of income this year was through our Major Sponsors and also Player Sponsorships ( both Junior and Senior ). The Club's Management Committee would like to thank all those who Sponsored the Club this year. By providing funds for better facilities and equipment, the success of the Adelaide Cricket Club will be enhanced, and, in being associated with a successful Club, our Sponsors will have an excellent vehicle for their promotion. While the major raffle was quite well supported ( and I would congratulate Bob Bernhardt on his efforts in organizing the raffle ) it is a little disappointing that we were still left with approx. 1000 tickets left unsold especially as it does not take too much effort to sell a couple of books.  
Another source of income this year was via the telephone book deliveries and again my thanks must go to Bob Farrell for the hours of work he put in to the organization of this effort and to those who assisted with the deliveries. The ladies who prepared lunches during the Country Carnival must also be thanked for their efforts.

In closing I would like to thank all those who have supported the Club by providing time and materials in order to keep the running costs of the club down. An enormous amount of work is done on a voluntary basis. I believe that our financial stability will influence our success on the field and the support of ALL players and members will ensure that we are a successful Club.
