PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Clubs such as Adelaide, which are involved in the elite cricket competition within South Australia measure success against a number of primary objectives.

A season without a single premiership would indicate a disappointing year. However, there were some positives that need to be recognised.

quite clearly the failure of our men's and women's A grade teams, in particular, to make the finals was not the outcome we wanted or expected. We have far too much talent in this club for us not to be there when it counts.

There was something special about our four under age sides making the finals, although it was unfortunate that none of them were able to get through to the grand final. The Ray Sutton Shield Gold side played with distinction earlier in the season and could so easily have earned the title as the best team in the competition. Their efforts nevertheless were particularly good. The Ray Sutton Shield Red side showed good signs of improvement as their season progressed and with many of the squad again eligible for 1995, the signs are good.

Undoubtedly our most pleasing achievement for the year has been the contribution made to State and National Competitions.

Lee-Anne Hunter and Karen Rolton have both made us very proud with their selection and performances for Australia and South Australia. Both players performed creditably during Australia's tour of New Zealand.

And hasn't it been great to see Ben Johnson and Jason Gillespie establish themselves in the South Australian side along side Paul Nobes. Paul Hutchison also represented South Australia during the season. We have not been noted for our contribution to senior State sides over previous seasons. Three players from our club participating in the shield final at the Gabba certainly turns that situation right around.

Congratulations are also in order to Brad Birrell and Brad Westley for their selection in under age State sides during the season and to Ben Hook and Erin Bernhardt, as well as Ben J, Jason and Paul H for selection in State second XI sides.

Off the field we were able to put together a most successful pre test match dinner at the Convention Centre in January. The cricket match held at Adelaide No. 2 ground between the Lord Mayor's XI and the South African High Commissioner's team was also appreciated by all those involved.

We have some challenging times ahead as a club. The financial report will show that our poor fund raising efforts for the season have hurt us financially. We also suffered badly by not having any matches at Bailey Reserve for the season. We are hoping we will see more people more involved in working for the club next season.

My thanks to Mike Hendricks for taking over the coaching duties for us this year, and to Rob Cairney for another amazing year of input as Secretary. The contribution and wisdom of Andrew McIntyre was also appreciated, as were the efforts of all those on the Committee. Thanks also to Leon Milford and Denis Kildare, who for personal reasons resigned from the committee in January. I again thank all who assisted with kitchen and bar duties, in particular, Jill, Anne, Tracy and Jonathan. Thanks also who assisted with coaching, scoring and team manager duties. Every effort helps, and is essential, to make our club work.

We look forward to a season next Summer that will see the further development of our junior players and a new level of achievement, both on and off the field.

COACHING DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Following the success of the 1993/94 season when the Men's A GRADE team played in the grand final, the club was looking towards the new season with a fair amount of optimism. Unfortunately as the year unfolded the A GRADE team never played to their full ability and finished out of the four with the B GRADE the only senior team to play in the finals.

The season got off to a bad start when last years coaching director DENIS KILDARE suffered a serious illness, which meant he couldn't continue in that role. Fortunately DOC has overcome his problems and we wish him every success in his move to QUEENSLAND.

The A GRADE had an unsettled season, we were inconsistent, and at times our attitude left a lot to be desired, it appeared that we expected to win and when we were in trouble, the hard work would be left to another player, that is always a recipe for failure. At times there was a lack of serious effort at training, this was difficult to understand, any player who wants to play in an A GRADE premiership and particularly those who have aspirations to play first class cricket, hard work and an understanding that they are only as good as their NEXT game is vital to their success.

Although we could not be satisfied with our efforts, there was a number of underlying reasons why we can still look to the future with a great deal of optimism. For the first time in twenty years our club supplied four players to the SOUTH AUSTRALIAN team. The highlight of the year was the selection of BEN JOHNSON and JASON GILLESPIE in the state team, they joined PAUL NOBES in the team and would have gained a lot of experience particularly playing in the SHEFFIELD SHIELD FINAL, PAUL HUTCHISON also represented the state early in the season.

Both BEN and Jason have bright futures at that level, providing they continue the same attitude as they have displayed so far. They are dedicated cricketers who work hard, are prepared to listen to advice and are good club members. combine these attributes with a lot of ability and you have the recipe for a successful player. They set a fine example for all other club members to follow.

Early in the season BEN and JASON were selected in the STATE SECOND XI with BEN HOOK, also BRAD BIRRELL (under 19) and BRAD WESTLEY (under 17) represented at state level, which indicates a lot of talent in the club. One encouraging sign was two young players, JASON RONEBERG and GAVIN O'REILLY started the season in the C GRADE and because of good and CONSISTENT performances, graduated to A GRADE. They both scored two centuries in the lower grades and while they would have been disappointed with their results in the top team, I'm sure that the experience they gained will prove invaluable in the future. I feel that with a solid and dedicated approach to next season, the top team will perform to the high standard that they are capable of.

The large loss of players through representative selections, injuries and various other reason, meant that all grades were seldom at full strength. However this gave many opportunities for players to be selected in higher grades, some people took advantage of their chances and finished the season at a more senior level to that in which they started.

ANDREW McINTYRE in his first season as a club captain, successfully led the B GRADE team into the finals. Our effort during the finals was disappointing mainly due to our experience, but I'm sure that that performance will be strong motivation for those players next year.

Shane Bernhardt and Tim Pitcher had extremely difficult jobs leading the C and D teams respectively. The unavailability of players in the higher grades telescoped the problem into the lower teams. With regular changes of personnel consistency and winning becomes difficult, the support and encouragement they both gave to the young players in their teams will greatly benefit those young men in the future.

I would like to thank Eric Freeman and Bob Gilbourne for their support during the year, their knowledge and experience was invaluable and the improvement in a number of players who were prepared to listen to their advice was very encouraging

I would like to thank all of the captains through out the season, in particular Tim Pitcher in his role as practice captain, and the time and effort he went to to ensure that all teams had a full compliment of players each week during a very difficult year. I would also take this opportunity to thank Bruce Westley who took over the practice captain's job when Tim became unavailable in the latter part of the season. Thanks also to John Roach for his invaluable support as A GRADE Manager.

B-GRADE REPORT

The excellent performance of the Adelaide Cricket Club B-Grade team during season 1994/95 should not be over-shadowed by the disappointment of our performance in the semi-final.

In almost all games during the season there was a critical point which required the team to perform under pressure. On the majority of occasions the commitment and desperation displayed was of a quality that enabled us to achieve our goal of finishing in the top four, therefore earning the right to participate in the finals.

Our performance in the semi-final could only be described as extremely disappointing. In hindsight, I accept that I may have made a mistake in not playing on on the second day of the semi-final, despite the fact that we had already lost on the first innings by stumps on the first day. Not playing on the Sunday may well have been an "easy way out". From a future "mental toughness" viewpoint it may well have been a benefit for our young players to have experienced the helplessness of playing on the second day, when the game was lost.

It would be fair to say that our performance in the semi-final, to a large extent, reflected our performances during the year. Invariably it was our batting which let us down, in the majority of games which we lost it was due to a lack of runs. On only two or three occasions during the season were we let down by our bowlers in any significant way. Throughout the season, with the exception of a couple of notable missed chances (our future AFL umpire!), our fielding was of the highest quality and our catching, lead by Michael Wood, also outstanding.

The team spirit and feeling within the team throughout the year was outstanding and was a significant contributing factor in our reaching the finals.

All of the players are aware of the enormity of our failing in the semi-final and it should serve as a spur to each and every one of us as we prepare ourselves for the 1995/96 season. As a team, and as individuals, we need to ensure that we never again allow ourselves to put in a performance like that on such an important occasion.

In the circumstances that prevailed in the semi-final it is up to every individual to find, within themselves, the sort of performance that is capable of rescuing the whole team. To all of the players involved you must, in the future, remember the sick feeling we all felt and use this as a motivator when faced with similar circumstances in the future. If we do use it in this positive way it will stand us in good stead for the future.

Season 1994/95 was difficult from a playing point of view. The thrill of seeing four players represent our club at Sheffield Shield level brought with it the challenge of replacing them when they were unavailable. The emergence of Sheffield Shield players from within our ranks, and the opportunity that this provides for other young players in the club to move up the grades is extremely positive as it rewards consistent performers in the lower grades and ensures that "established" players do not become complacent and perform inconsistently.

Along with the movement of players up the grades, as a result of our State playing commitments, we suffered greatly due to injuries and the unavailability of players at various times. At one stage there were eight senior players unavailable for club selection as a result of representative selection, injury or unavailability. The depth of our talent and character of our young players was certainly put to the test. As far as players given the opportunity in B-grade was concerned, in the overwhelming majority of cases the players showed that they have what it takes to be outstanding players for this club over a long period of time. Players such as Matthew Tucker, Abel Podger, Paul Amato, David Forster and Craig Cooper all showed that they have what it takes and they should look forward to next season with tremendous enthusiasm.

All players should recognise the enormous opportunities that are offered by the Adelaide Cricket Club at this time. The opportunity to be a part of a very successful era in our club's history is available for those who want it badly enough.

The tremendous character shown by this side throughout the season came to the fore during the last three games of the season. Having won three of our first five games outright and one of the other two on the first innings, our second loss for the season occurred in the last minor round game prior to Christmas and left us sitting in second position on the premiership table at that time. We then lost the first four games after Christmas to drop out of the top four for the first time during the season.

From this point we defeated Salisbury, Kensington and University to earn our place in the finals. During these three matches there were some outstanding individual performances, Jason Roneberg's 100 at Salisbury followed by Ben Arthur's five wickets, Paul Amato's gutsy innings at Col Waite followed by Warren Mitchell and Matthew Tucker's two hour demolition of the Kensington batting line-up. Finally, against University our bowlers were outstanding with Ben Arthur again a standout and then the spine-tlingling run chase with Paul Boss and Ben "Bradman" Arthur the heroes of our fighting victory.

We finished the season with seven first innings, three of which we converted to outright results, and six losses, one being an outright loss against Woodville.

From an individual player perspective you can be assured that every player in the side is looked upon as a potential A-grade player. Given the right circumstances, and the willingness by the individual to work hard these opportunities will arise in season 1995/96. Each player must realise however, that it is up to him to make it happen. Success is the responsibility of the individual, to blame others for a lack of individual success is wrong. If you want success bad enough you will work so hard that you will achieve it. People standing in the way of your achievement of that success should only act as a motivator.

To all the players I thank them for their efforts and contributions during the year. We enjoyed some success and had many enjoyable times together. Lets look forward to many more good times next season.

There were many outstanding individual performances during the year however none more so than that of Michael Wood. Despite being struck down with a number of injuries during the season Michael won the batting and fielding trophy and finished second in the bowling trophy, had it not been for injuries he would have certainly won this award also.

As captain I cannot speak highly enough of Michael's efforts during the year. On all occasions Michael gave fully committed performances and he was instrumental in securing many of the victories that the team achieved during the season. His assistance from a tactical point of view was also of enormous benefit (though not against University!). I am of the firm belief that 1995/96 will see Michael cement his position at A-grade level for the Adelaide Cricket Club. His work ethic and commitment are, in my eyes, unquestioned and he needs only an opportunity to establish himself as a consistently successful player at that level.

Ben Arthur won the bowling trophy in 'B' grade despite playing half of the season in 'A' grade. Ben is definitely a bowler of 'A' grade quality and, given the right opportunity, will cement his place in that side. A fiercely competitive and committed young man it was always a delight to have Ben in my side and I hope that he enjoys many successful years playing cricket for Adelaide.

One of the more experienced players who had a particularly disappointing season, but who has an enormous amount to offer the club at A-grade level in the future, is Damien Kitto. Damien's performance, when the acid was really on him, in the semi-final showed the sort of fighting ability that he has got, he made only six runs but given the season he had, his innings showed a lot of commitment and pride. No-one was more disappointed in our performance than Damien. His assistance in a tactical sense to me all season was invaluable and I believe that in future Damien has the ability to be an outstanding leader of this club.

The redevelopment of the Bailey Reserve and the club's inability to host home games each round was one of the main reasons for such a poor return.

The local resident committee who attempt to thwart every fund raising venture we conduct at Bailey Clubrooms only exacerbates our situation.

In previous years the club has relied upon structured efforts to raise funds from within our ranks by undertaking one major club drive each season - distribution of telephone book, selling of credit Union raffle tickets, selling of fund raising chocolates, etc, each year these efforts usually meet with reasonable resistance and poor effort by many. For 1994/95 the committee decided to put the responsibility back on the members and let the members decide for themselves how best they could raise the much needed funds. Hence the individual team requirement of \$500 per team for the entire season. **What a failure !!!**

The winter months will require considerable fund raising efforts from us all - please do what you can to assist - don't leave it to your team mates.

Our budget for 1995/96 will be very tight and will require an all out effort in the timely collection of player subscriptions and fund raising. We do intend to try once again the \$500 Team Fund Raiser - don't allow a repeat of 1994/95.

Whilst our Balance Sheet shows a severe shortage of ready funds, the substantial amount of Fixed Assets is a sign of our long term strength and the Net Member's Funds of \$100000, is the envy of most other Grade Clubs.

Three years ago the club made the decision to take on a large debt and purchase Park 23. This site is essential to the long term well being of our club and must be retained at all costs.

The poor fund raising and lack of home games must be addressed and compensation found. All club members will be asked to come to the fore and assist with winter fund raising. The Adelaide Cricket Club is your club don't fail your club.
